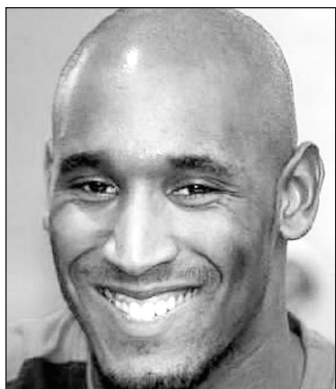

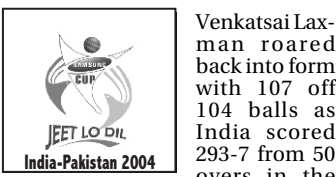

# Laxman saves best for last

one-dayer against Pakistan here on Wednesday.

Laxman's sixth one-day hundred steadied the tourists after Pakistan captain Inzamamul Haq won his fifth toss in a row and elected to field in the day-night game.

Pakistan face a target of almost six runs an over under lights at the Gaddafi Stadium to break the 2-2 deadlock and gain a psychological edge ahead of the three-Test series starting on Sunday.

The total is identical to what Pakistan made in the fourth one-dayer at the same venue on Sunday which India won with five overs to spare.

The 29-year-old Laxman, who managed just 27 runs in three previous innings in the series, struck 11 boundaries and raised his century with a single to long-on off spin bowler Shoaib Malik before departing in the 46th over, miscu-

ing an attempted pull off Malik while trying to force the pace.

India plundered 19 runs in the last two overs due to belligerent batting by tail-enders. Irfan Pathan, with a brisk 20 not out, and Lakshmiopathy Balaji, who hit an unbeaten 10 off six balls, gave the total a boost in the final overs with some unorthodox, but effective, hitting.

Mohammad Sami, who claimed 3-63, led a fightback by the Pakistani bowlers, whose five wides and as many no-balls were a vast improvement on the 58 wides and 40 no-balls they conceded in the first four matches.

Lanky seamer Shabbir Ahmed finished with 2-56 while Shoaib Akhtar and Malik claimed one wicket apiece.

Among the 25,000 fans at the overflowing stadium was Pakistan President Pervez Musharraf, who watched the match for an hour alongside Indian industrialist Nusli Wadia, the grandson of Pakistan's founder Mohammad Ali Jinnah.

The Bombay-based Wadia was a special invitee of the Pakistan government to the match, part of India's first full tour of the neighbours since 1989.

Openers Virender Sehwag

and Tendulkar gave India an explosive start, Sehwag cutting paceman Shoaib Akhtar over point off the second ball of the innings and Tendulkar clipping Shabbir through the on-side for an early boundary.

But India lost both of them by the 15th over, at which time they had put 79 runs on the board.

Shabbir hit back, though, in the sixth over when he had Sehwag caught behind for a 22-ball 20.

Tendulkar, one-day cricket's most successful batsman, failed to make 50 for the sixth successive time in a major final when he edged Sami to wicketkeeper Moin Khan after making 37.

Indian captain Sourav Ganguly added 92 for the third wicket with Laxman when he was dismissed by Akhtar for 45.

Rahul Dravid fell for four, Yuvraj Singh for 18 and Mohammad Kaif for 16 as the Indian middle-order failed to cash in on Laxman's efforts.

The one-day series will be followed by three tests, starting in Multan on March 28.

# Lehmann puts Aus atop

Darren Lehmann scored his fifth Test century to help Australia pile up 314 for six on the opening day of the third and final Test against Sri Lanka on Wednesday.

Skipper Ricky Ponting led from the front in the first two sessions with an aggressive 92 and found support from Lehmann, who continued throughout the evening to finish unbeaten on 104.

Ponting and Lehmann stole the initiative with a 121-run partnership for the fourth wicket after Australia had slipped to 96 for three in their first innings shortly after lunch.

Ponting missed out of his first century of a lean series when he spooned up a simple catch to mid-off from the last delivery of the afternoon session from Chaminda Vaas. Ponting's 138-ball innings included 11 fours and one six.

Lehmann, though, continued to resist Sri Lanka's bowlers during the evening session, adding 27 with Simon Katich (14) and 55 with Adam Gilchrist (22) during for sixth wicket stand.

Lehmann, dropped on 20 at slip, extended his series aggregate to 323 in five innings during a knock that included 11 powerful fours and one lofted six.

"Its good to get some runs... and making up for lost time. You have got to have a plan (in Sri Lanka) and my plan seems to be working at the moment which is good," said Lehmann.

"I am quite confident coming down the wicket and I think you have to back yourself to do that over here.

"In the past teams have come here and let the spinners dictate but we have certainly gone about it in a different way and had some success doing so."

Experienced left-armer Vaas was the pick of Sri Lanka's bowlers, probing away on a good batting pitch to finish with three for 76

from 20 overs.

Off-spinner Muttiah Muralitharan was repelled for much of the day but picked up two wickets in the evening, extending his career tally to 507 as he finished with two for 84.

Sri Lanka's morning started badly when left-arm paceman Nuwan Zoysa broke down with a calf injury after bowling 3.3 overs with the new ball.

However, the hosts remained hopeful he would bowl later in the match after ultrasound scans revealed no serious muscle damage.

Australia's openers put on 43 before Vaas had Justin Langer caught at mid-wicket for 19.

All-rounder Thilan Samaraweera replaced Zoysa and removed Matthew Hayden for 25 when the opener miscued a lofted drive and was caught at mid-off.

Australia reached lunch on 96 for two but then lost Damien

# Saqlain's teesra trick

Saqlain Mushtaq, who introduced the off-spinners' googly or the "doosra" (the other one) to international cricket, is developing a "teesra" (the third one) in a bid to win back a place in the Pakistan team.

Saqlain, 27, said he hoped the new variation would help him return during a three-Test series against India, starting in Multan on March 28.

"I've realised it's necessary to keep on bringing variations into your bowling to survive in the hectic world of international cricket," he told Reuters on Wednesday.

"There is no survival without variation."

Saqlain, who has grown a beard and leads the prayer congregations of the Pakistan team, has a haul of 207 Test and 288 one-day wickets but has played just one Test and one one-dayer for Pakistan since September last year.

He says he is willing to bide his time because his renewed interest

in religion has taught him to be patient. However, he stresses his hunger to play for Pakistan has not diminished.

"I've a strong urge to play in the Tests against India. I knew I'd have to come up with something different to surprise their top-class batting. Thus, the different ball," he said.

Saqlain declined to divulge
