Saifur asks NGOs to cut rate to 12pc, warns of govt funds freeze

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Following the interest rate waiver on agriculture loans, the government yesterday asked nationalised commercial banks (NCBs), including Bangladesh Krishi Bank, to provide collateral -free loans to farmers from Pahela Baishakh (April 14).

The government believes the waiver of cumulative interest on farm

loans will directly benefit around 15 lakh small and marginal farmers, as it will free them from the burden of loan and associated harassment.

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman at a cabinet meeting yesterday instructed the banks also to revoke all orders on attachment of property against certificate cases on agriculture loans and arrest warrants against farmers.

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia

chaired the weekly regular cabinet meeting at her office.

Interest rates on agriculture loans would be lowered to 8 percent from 10 percent at the same time.

Security in Old Dhaka tightened

The government has beefed up security in violence-scarred Old Dhaka deploying uniformed and undercover policemen and heightening intelligence watch after a spate of businesspeople killings.

A high official told The Daily Star yesterday that the government deployed uniformed police in force and 100 undercover police teams each comprising 20 men, in different business hot spots in the old quar-

Cops say on trader, son murders

Killers of Old Dhaka businessman Shamsul Hag and his son Russell Sheikh continue threatening their family on the phone as police and intelligence agencies have failed to hunt prime suspect Kaial and others down even four days into the double murder.

Police say they have mounted watch on and around the house of the businessmen after they received a complaint from the family and Detective Branch, Criminal Investigation Department (CID).

Special Branch and other agencies concerned are working separately to net the criminals.

Several teams have left Dhaka for undisclosed destinations to arrest Kaial and his associates.

Police suspect that the same killers of Shamsul and his son killed Buddhu and Hannan at the Mitford hospital premises Tuesday night and watch trader Rejaul Karim Selim on March 4 in a desperate bid to conceal their identity.

"We are aware of that (Tuesday's killings) and their killing had links to

After experiencing an unchanged price situation in the kitchen market for the last three weeks, city dwellers might again face a price hike, especially of vegetables, if the current drought like situation lingers on for another week or more, city traders cautioned.

The price situation, especially of vegetables and spices stayed the same since the last rise three weeks ago. The prices of soyabean oil, atta, pulses and ginger, which experienced a significant rise during the previous months, seem unlikely to come down immediately, traders in the city kitchen markets said.

In the city's Hatirpul kitchen market yesterday, per kilogram ginger was selling at Tk 65-70 from Tk 35-40 three weeks ago soyabean selling at 58-60 a litre, a two-kg packet of atta at Tk 32, up from Tk 28 only 3-4 weeks ago, and pulses especially masur (lentils) vas selling at Tk 44.

In the same market the prices of all sorts of powder milk like Dano. Diploma, Kwality and other baby foods remained unchanged as they

were for the last two to three weeks. In city's Palashi kitchen market per kilo tomato was selling at Tk 10-12, potato was selling at Tk 8-10, local beans Tk 12-15, cucumber Tk

Sources concerned said this period could alone account for over Tk 20,000 crore of alleged embezzlement out of the total unresolved audit objections involving Tk 28,000 crore during the 1971-2002 period.

Due to the heavy backlog, Pac decided to share the workload with Cag while Pac will deal with the cases from 1990 till 2002. The committee will discuss its overall progress on October 31, said


