



In the land of the Pathans, it is an Indian Pathan who has impressed one and all with his exploits on the cricket field

and his humility. In just three weeks in Pakistan, young Irfan Pathan has become a household name and even among the cricket stars, he is a star in his own rights.

Pakistani greats such as Imran Khan, Wasim Akram and former Australian captain Ian Chappell are gushing the superb performance of the left-arm seamer in one-day internationals and the Multan Test match where he made an impressive contribution to India's win.

Many of those who saw Pathan are reminded of young Akram and predict that he has the potential to become a top fast bowler. He is much in demand by autograph hunters and journalists but all this has not gone to the head of the 19year-old Baroda speedster. "I will never be carried away with

the attention I am getting. I am keeping my feet very much on the ground and Insha Allah I will keep doing it," he says. It has been a phenomenal rise for the youngster ever since making his Test debut against Australia in the

second Test at Adelaide late last

year, having improved by leaps and

bounds after every match. Pathan believes that there is no shortcut to success and whatever he has achieved so far has been because of his hard work. "Yeh sab Allah kim meherbani hai (It's all due to God's grace)," he says.
