PM urges Bhutanese envoy

One gets death penalty for killing wife

A court in Khulna yesterday sentenced a man to death for killing his wife.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Mosharraf Hossain passed the sentence on Sylvester Roy alias Tito.

According to the prosecution, Sylvester Roy, whose conjugal life was not a happy one, hacked his wife Mahmuda Khatoon to death on July 5, 2000 at Mathurabad under Dumuria thana and dumped her body in a canal there.

Police recovered the body the next day and arrested Sylvester from Khulna city.

Both husband and wife were tailors.

Jayanti murder case transferred for quick disposal

Judge Matiur Rahman of the Dhaka Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court sent the Jayanti Reza murder case yesterday to the Third Additional Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court, Dhaka for quick disposal.

The Detective Branch (DB) on March 30 indicted Azam Reza for killing his wife Jayanti Munshi alias Jayanti Reza and dropped the names of television performers Shampa Reza and Afsana Mimi from the charge sheet as the allegations against them could not be proved.

Investigation Officer (IO) DB inspector Ruhul Quddus submitted the charge sheet to the Court of Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Dhaka after 82 days of the incident.

Ruhul Quddus in the charge sheet said that primary investigation was based on the first information report (FIR), statements of 20 witnesses and the post-mortem report found Azam Reza guilty.

The IO quoting the post-mortem report said, death was due to cerebral failure resulted from head injury, which was homicidal in nature.

Police recovered the body of Jayanti, a teacher of Australian International School, hanging from the ceiling fan in their Banani residence on January 9 afternoon. Jayanti's mother filed a General Diary (GD) with Gulshan Police Station, Gulshan Police Station.

The British High Commission and the Department for International Development (DFID) have assured that more assistance would be provided for better environment management system in Bangladesh.

They also called for improving the livelihoods of poor people through sustainable management of the environment, as there is a link between the environment and poverty.

The high commission recently accorded a reception to development partners in the environment sector, aimed at promoting greater interaction between them and exploring ways to fight poverty.

Representatives of organisations working on environment, entrepreneurs and environment officials attended the reception ceremony.

British High Commissioner David

Carter, Deputy Speaker Akther Hamid Siddiqui and Environment Secretary Syed Tanvir Hossain were also present.

The DFID has already announced an assistance of 20 million pound sterling towards protecting environment.

In the past few years, good environmental practice has played a major role in sustaining poverty reduction, said Tim Robertson, natural resources and environmental advisor to DFID.

"The British High Commission's long-term commitment to environment includes educating the future leaders of Bangladesh through a schools programme," said Russel Bud of the high commission.

He said the UK has been supporting various projects, including renewable energy, climate change awareness, environmental education and genetically modified organisms (GMOs).

The test will begin at 9:00am.


