No hartal in Netrakona

OUR CORRESPONDENT, Netrakona Hartal (strike) was not observed here yesterday.

No procession was brought out and no picketers were seen on the streets. All government and non-government offices, shops and educational institutions remained open. Bus, tempo, auto-rickshaw and other vehicles plied normally.

However, hundreds of riot police were posted at different points in the town from Tuesday evening.

Tenage girl killed after gang-rape

OUR CORRESPONDENT, Netrakona Four rapists killed a teenage girl in broad daylight after gang rape at Islampur here on Tuesday.

Angry people caught three of them red-handed on the spot and handed over them to police.

Police and witnesses said four culprits named Dailur Rahman, Mintu, Shafiqul Islam and Khorshed Alam of Changergor village strangled a 14-year-old girl named Banacha Begum, daughter of late Tajul Islam of Singbanga village after gang-rape beside a secluded pond at Changergor village. As the victim screamed before death, local people rushed there and caught three culprits except Khorshed Alam who managed to escape. Victim's mother Fatema Begum filed a case with Islampur police.

Ershad Shikder's execution: Letter yet to reach jail

The Khulna district jail authorities are yet to receive an official letter relating to execution of the death penalty of condemned prisoner Ershad Shikder.

The letter addressed to the superintendent of the district jail was posted on April 4 from Mafizul Islam, assistant registrar of the Supreme Court, but the jail super did not receive it till Tuesday afternoon.

The letter contains information about dismissal of Ershad Shikder's review petition appealing for commuting death sentence given by High Court in the Juba League leader Khalid Hossain murder case.

Meanwhile, two armed guards have been deployed inside Ershad Shikder's cell, the jail super said.

Three killed in Habiganj road accident

Three persons were killed and two others seriously injured when a truck carrying them fell into a roadside ditch at Minajpur in Nabiganj upazila on Tuesday.

The dead are Khokan, 45, Kamal, 35, and an unidentified chili trader of Comilla.

Police said the truck was going to Sylhet from Comilla with chili. The injured were admitted to Nabiganj Upazila Health Complex.

Orchid export is in sight

BAU scientist evolves method for commercial production

The Department of Biotechnology of Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU) has developed a technology for commercial production of orchid plants, opening up a prospect for their export.

Dr Khondoker M Nasiruddin, Head of Department of Biotechnology, told The Daily Star that his department has evolved seven varieties of orchid seedlings from their export.

These are Dendrobium, Vanda, Phaius, Phaelanopsis, Aeridis, Rhynchostylis, Cymbidium and Arundina.

Now, orchid seedlings are nor-

mally purchased from Thailand at Tk 35 per piece, which can be reduced to Tk 5, he said.

Normally, orchids are grown both through vegetative means and seed breeding.

But seeds contain a very minute quantity of stored food and so there is less possibility of their germination in natural atmosphere.

Using the traditional vegetative method of propagation, only three or four plants can be produced in a year.

The new technology is called micropropagation, in which vitro seed culture, leaf culture and internode culture are used.

Tiny orchid seeds are placed on

tissues for nourishment. After several

days, these germinate. These are re-cultured with hormone.

Dr Nasiruddin said standardisation of the varieties is near completion at BAU laboratories.

Several big nurseries trading in orchid have contacted them for orchid seedlings, he said.

If commercially produced, orchids can be exported, he said.

BAU Vice-chancellor Prof Dr M Amirul Islam recently handed over the first consignment of Dendrobium orchid seedlings to Micro Orchids and Plants of Savar. About 95 per cent of the seedlings survived, he said.



Stalemate at CU continues

Stalemate at Chittagong University (CU) continued for the fourth consecutive day on Tuesday.

Academic activities were completely stopped.

The stalemate was created on Saturday following enforcement of an indefinite siege by the left leaning Progressive Students' Alliance (PSA).

Meanwhile, a two-day work abstention programme of the Chittagong University Teachers' Association (CUTA) ended on Tuesday.

CUTA observed their two-day work abstention demanding punishment and expulsion of Shibir cadres allegedly led by its CU unit president Jahid Hossain Bhuiyan who attacked and injured Finance department Lecturer Akhter Hossain Piaru on the CU playground on Friday.

CUTA president and general secretary met vice chancellor Professor AJM Nuruddin Chowdhury at his office and gave an ultimatum to fulfill their demand by Friday next. CUTA would declare their next course of action at a general meeting on Saturday if their demands are not met.

PSA, a forum of three left-leaning student organisations, enforced a programme of siege protesting attack on their activists by Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal cadres on Thursday.

CONFERENCE TOLD Develop grassroots women leadership

Development of women leadership at grassroots level is a must to eradicate the problems faced by the womenfolk in the country.

This was stated by speakers at a women's conference at the Badarganj upazila auditorium on Tuesday, attended by about 200 women leaders.

The conference with the slogan Women rights: Human rights was organized jointly by Nagork Uddog (citizens' initiative) and Nari Netra Bikash Network (NNBN—network for growth of women leadership).

With Shusannya Toppa in the chair, it was addressed by, among others, Badarganj Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Mahabubul Alam, Upazila Social Welfare Officer Abdur Razzak, Badarganj thana officer-in-charge Golam Mostafa, Nagork Uddog official ATM Saiduzzaman, Fatema Begum, Afroza Begum and Fuahira Begum.

They called upon the womenfolk to resist adolescent and child marriage, violence against woman, dowry and fatwa (verdict by religious cleric) and other social taboos.

They also urged women to vote for women candidates in local body polls to send their representatives to those for their empowerment.

The conference formed a convening committee headed by Mohosina Begum and adopted a one-year working plan to create awareness among women about their rights.

Nor'wester lashes three Netrakona upazilas

Fifteen persons were wounded and about 1,000 kutcha houses were damaged in a nor'wester accompanied by hailstorm which swept over Netrakona Sadar, Atpara and Purbadhal upazilas on Tuesday evening.

The hailstorm damaged standing boro crops on about 500 acres of land.

According to the district administration, the 45-minute cyclonic storm caused widespread damage in the three upazilas.

The nor'wester which lashed with a velocity of 100 km per hour destroyed over a dozen educational institutions and uprooted hundreds of trees. Electricity and telephone connection was also snapped.

CASE FILED AGAINST RAJSHAHI NGO

Depositors want return of money

Several hundred field employees and members of a local NGO — Samaj Unnayan Karma Shangstha (SUKS) — laid a siege to its office here and brought out a procession in the city on Tuesday demanding return of their money and arrest of its authorities for alleged irregularities.

SUKS, based in Rajshahi, started operation last year.

It enrolled members through its 70 branch offices in Dinajpur, Bogra, Joypurhat, Naogaon, Natore, Chapainawabganj and Rajshahi districts.

Its field employees collected money from it for members.

The demonstrators alleged that the NGO collected deposits offering them attractive benefits.

They have fulfilled terms of deposits but the NGO is not neither giving them any benefit nor returning

their money. Sources said the NGO was operating without Bangladesh Bank's approval.

Talking to this correspondent, many of them alleged that the NGO have them cheques, which were dishonoured by banks.

The NGO has reportedly closed some of its branches in Natore, Naogaon, Chapainawabganj and Rajshahi districts after its members there assaulted some field workers for alleged irregularities.

Sources said, on March 29, Bagha upazila branch manager of the NGO Alamgir Hossain filed a case with the Rajshahi Chief Metropolitan Magistrate against its chairman SAQM Harun, managing director Nazrul Islam and director (accounts) Naimuddin for misappropriating Tk 13.65 lakh of depositors' money.

Boalia thana police said they are investigating the case.

WDB dam in Bhola breaches a year after construction

Crops on about 300 acres of land reeled under water in Char Nuton in Charsfenn upazila in Bhola district following a breach in a dam there in the early hours of yesterday.

The dam was built by the Water Development Board (WDB) last year at a cost of about Tk 2.5 crore to protect the area from flooding by the Meghna river, sources said.

In the afternoon, BCL activists brought out a procession in the town protest Mamun's arrest.

JCD, student front of ruling BNP, also brought out a procession demanding punishment of the persons who desecrated the prime minister's photo.

Mamun is the son of Barguna AL General Secretary.

The photo was set right when the NDC and the OC of Barguna thana went there on information.

At a press conference at Barguna Press Club on Tuesday night, local AL leaders alleged that it was an "arranged drama" to arrest opposition leaders and workers to foil the anti-government movement.

Mamun was produced before court Tuesday morning, which sent him to jail.

In the afternoon, BCL activists brought out a procession in the town protest Mamun's arrest.

When contacted over phone yesterday, sources there said hundreds of panic-stricken people in the area including women were trying to repair the breached portion of the dam on voluntary basis.

They said crops including vegetables and newly sown IRI-Boro fields have gone under water. More areas are being flooded as water is gushing through the breach, they said.

Anti-drug meet held at Satkhira
