Bomb scare at **Secretariat**

A bomb scare prompted the police to conduct a search inside the Secretariat for three hours on Wednesday night, but in vain.

He said 20 people were attacked by the disease at Laxmipur alone in the town during the last four days.

Dr Rafiqul Islam, an experi dispatched by the health directorate, apprehended that the disease might spread to other parts in the district.
