

PRICE HIKE OF BABY FOODS

Children observe token hunger strike

Some three hundreds children and their parents yesterday observed a token hunger strike at the Central Shaheed Minar protesting the price hike of baby foods.

Under the banner of Banglar Ma O Shishu (Mother and Children of Bangladesh), the protesters demanded of the government to take immediate steps to bring down the prices of baby foods.

Speaking at the programme, Shyamoli Nasreen Chowdhury blamed the government for its failure to control the price of baby foods.

"Not only the price of baby foods but also the price of all essentials have increased beyond the purchasing power of the common people. But the government is totally indifferent to

the matter," she added.

Shyamoli urged the government to take immediate steps to curb the price spiral of essentials considering the sufferings of the people.

Afroza Banu, a cultural activist, said those who are running the government are responsible for the price hike.

"We want to see a bright future for our children but the government has no interest in their welfare," she added.

Falguni Hameed, another cultural activist, said the price hike of essentials has made the lives of common people miserable.

"If proper steps are not taken to bring down the price, we will launch greater movement," she threatened.

Eminent actress Ferdousi Mazumder moderated the hunger strike programme.

Show cause on B Chowdhury over party name

A declaratory suit was filed against former president and convenor of Bikalpa Dhara AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury yesterday seeking a temporary injunction on forming his new political party name "Bangladesh Party" (BDP).

Nazim Habib Uzzaman, president of Bangladesh Democratic Party (BDP) filed the suit along with a petition for a temporary injunction with the Fourth Assistant Judge's Court, Dhaka.

In the suit, Nazim Habib mentioned that he formed his party as "Bangladesh Democratic Party" on January 1, 1999 and established it as a popular party. But he came to know on March 26 through newspapers that Badruddoza decided to name his political party as "Bangladesh Party" (BDP). So he prayed for a temporary injunction on forming his (Badruddoza) new political party name "Bangladesh Party".

After hearing Judge Anisur Rahman issued a show cause notice upon Badruddoza to explain within 15 days from the date of receipt of the notice why he should not be restrained by an order of temporary injunction to form Bangladesh Party (BDP).



2 die in road accident

Two rickshawpullers were killed and several others injured in a road accident at Nababganj upazila in Dhaka yesterday.

The victims were identified as Halud Meah, 28, and Monirul Islam, 20.

The accident occurred when driver of the bus lost control of the steering and drove it into a roadside shop near the Ticketpur bus stand.

Truck helper shot, driver mugged

A truck helper was shot and its driver mugged in the city yesterday.

A gang of eight muggers put up a barricade by placing stones on the road near Basila in Mohammadpur to stop two trucks laden with fruits at around 3:00am.

The driver of one truck managed to avoid the barricade, but the other had to park his truck.

The muggers boarded the truck and looted Tk 2,500 from driver Bellal and shot helper Abul Kalam in his neck and fled the spot.

Kalam was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where he is undergoing treatment.

Both Mirpur and Mohammadpur Police Stations said they knew the incident but it did not take place in their jurisdiction.
