RAB likely to start operation in Ctg this month

Work on the setting up of Rapid Action Battalion (RAB) camp started in Chittagong on Saturday.

The abandoned Chittagong Steel Mills (CSM) Hospital building will be turned into the camp and the office of Chittagong RAB.

Chittagong is the second city where the RAB is going to operate after it was first introduced in Dhaka.

RAB Chittagong sources said the force is expected to start its operation in the last week of this

month. Lieutenant Colonel Quazi Emdadul Haque, who has been appointed commanding officer of RAB Chittagong, took over the charge of the building on Saturday.

Prior to his new assignment, the colonel was working as the Chief Instructor of School of Infantry and Tactical (commando wing), Sylhet.

Ten police personnel from the Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) started work on setting up the camp at the hospital building. It remained abandoned since the halt of production of Chittagong Steel Mills.

RAB Chittagong will have 688 personnel from Army, Navy, Air Force, Anser battalion and police, Of them about 200 personnel, including 60 officers, are from the CMP.

"We are now preparing the office and expect to get everything set before we receive order to start operation from the higher authorities," said the commanding officer.

in a bid to silence freethinking in the

Prof Shakhawat Ali Khan, chairman of the department, said they would take extensive programmes to protest such incidents and asked. "Why do we have to come out (on the street) to condemn such threats?"

Prof Golam Rahman said no-one is safe in the country these days. People want to express their opinions freely in a democratic manner, he added.

On April 4, Sarbahara Dal, a shady organisation, issued the threat to the Duta president and also asked him to pay Tk 50,000 in toll to Mohammad Kuddus Mian, storekeeper of GK Garment of Ullal Bazaar in Savar, to save his life


