### Kalidas Boral murder case begins Monday

Trial of advocate Kalidas Boral murder case will begin at the Speedy Trial Tribunal here on April 19.

Advocate Kalidas Boral, senior vice president of Bagerhat Awami League, was gunned down on August 20, 2000.

His wife Happy Boral filed an FIR with Bagerhat sadar thana on August 21. The case was transferred to speedy trial tribunal on March 30.

Six out of 22 charged sheeted accused are in jail hajat, 13 are on bail while three are absconding, court sources said.

### Dissolution of JCD body demanded

Several hundred activists of Jatiyatobabli Chhatra Dal (JCD) brought out a procession and held a rally at Dashmina upazila headquarters on Thursday demanding dissolution of the newly formed upazila JCD body.

The rally was addressed by, among others, JCD leaders Shamim Ahmed, Rashedul Hasan, Abdul Kajum Ripon, Mahbub Helal, Humayun Ahmed and Abdulla.

They told the rally that the new upazila JCD body, formed without a council, is a pocket committee of district JCD president.

They gave a five-day deadline for its dissolution and threatened of greater agitation for non-compliance.

The newly formed Dashmina JCD, formed on April 3, is headed by Al Amin. The last council of the upazila JCD was held in 1990.

## REOPENING OF RANGPUR SUGAR MILLS DEMANDED Mass hunger strike held, hartal in Gaibandha Tuesday

A mass hunger strike, joined by local leaders of all political except ruling BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami, was observed on Gaibandha Shaheed Miner premise on Thursday demanding reopening of Rangpur Sugar Mills.

The five-hour token hunger strike was organised jointly by the District Workers and Employees Federation and Bangladesh Sugar Mills Workers Union.

It was followed by a rally, where speakers called upon the people to make the earlier announced April 20 hartal in the district a success to press the government to withdraw the lay-off of the mill.

The government laid off the mill on March 31 on the plea of recurring loss.

Leaders of Awami League (AL), Workers Party, 11-Party Alliance,

Communist Party, Gono Forum, National Awami Party (NAP) joined the mass hunger strike and extended their support to the programmes for reopening of the mill.

The rally, presided over by Habibul Hossain, president of the district Workers and Employees Federation, was addressed by AL President Mohammad Khaled, 11-Party Alliance Convenor Mihir Ghosh, Workers Party Secretary Aminul Islam Golap, NAP President Lutfar Rahman Ranju, CPB central leader Wasirul Rahman Rafiq, Bangladesher Samajtantrik Dal (BSD) leader Mosadek Hossain Bulbul, Transport Workers Union leader Mahbubur Rahman, Rangpur Sugar Mills Workers Union President Abdul Matin and Jatiya Sanajtantrik Dal (JSD) leader Ziaul Huq Jhony.

They bitterly criticised the government for declaring the mill laid-off. This government is closing down mills one after another without creating employment opportunities, they said.

The Rangpur sugar mill incurred losses due to wrong policy, not because of workers and employees.

The mill authorities took a huge amount of loan from the World Bank and spent it on unproductive heads. The mill incurred losses as it had to bear an annual interest of around Tk three crore on the loans, they said.

By closing down the mill, the government has compelled the workers and employees to go for agitation. The government alone will be responsible for any situation if the mill is not reopened, they said.

Meanwhile, people in Mohimaganj continued to keep black flags hoisted atop houses, shops and private offices protesting the lay-off of the mill.

## Removal of Barisal war memorial foundation sparks protests

Demolition of a foundation stone, laid in 1997 for building a Liberation War memorial in the city's court area, has evoked strong criticism from people including freedom fighters, political and cultural activists.

The foundation, laid on the Victory Day in 1997 by people defying Section 144 by the then administration, was removed allegedly by the Barisal City Corporation (BCC) on Wednesday night.

Some shop owners in the area claimed that BCC employees and workers removed the foundation along with some big palm trees and completed expansion of a road there overnight for movement of the Prime Minister's convoy.

The Prime Minister on Thursday laid the foundation of a new court complex there.

As the news of demolition of the foundation stone spread in the city

Thursday morning, hundreds of people visited the area and expressed their shock.

Syed Dulal, president of Barisal Sangskritik Shanghatan Samanaya Parishad (cultural organizations' coordination committee)

expressed his deep shock and said BCC Mayor, who is also convenor of the district freedom fighters organization, can not avoid the responsibility for removal of the foundation stone. Its leaders will sit today to decide an agitation programme, sources said.

Advocate Manabendra Botabaly, ex-president of the Barisal Bar Association and the Barisal unit of Udichi, a cultural forum, condemned the incident and demanded immediate restoration of the foundation stone at the same place.

Mintu Bose, president of Kheyali Group Theatre, Manirul Hasan Khan, joint secretary of district Awami League, Prof Mohsinul Islam Habul,

Speakers at the rally, who included some teachers, demanded permanent expulsion of the accused and his accomplices and other legal measures against them.

They gave a three-day deadline and threatened of agitation for non-compliance.

The SUAST Teachers Association also demanded action against the accused. The female teachers also handed over a memorandum to the acting Vice-chancellor of the university demanding action against the accused.

The victim, a second year Honours student of Social Science in her complaint alleged that, Sadi took her to a boarding house in the city's Rikabibazar area on Sunday last on the plea of some urgent talks.

Meanwhile, about 2000 students and teachers formed a human chain, brought out a procession and held a rally in front of the Registrar building on Thursday demanding punishment to

the accused.

He tortured and sexually abused her while some of his accomplices waited outside the room, she alleged in her complaint.

Barisal divisional president of teachers association and leaders of other socio-political and cultural organisations also condemned demolition of the foundation stone and demand its restoration.

In 1997, people protested when BCC had leased the spot for construction of a market.

The lease had sparked agitation by people that led to clashes. After three months' agitation, thousands of people on December 16, 1997, defied Section 144 imposed in the area by the then district administration and laid the foundation for a Liberation War memorial.

A project for building a memorial and a children park there was approved and funds allocated, sources said.

When contacted, BCC Chief Executive Officer Ranjit Kumar Das said they removed the palm trees but not the foundation stone to widen the adjacent road.

Representatives of Shippers Council of Bangladesh and the Mongla Port Authority (MPA) on Monday exchanged views on improving services at the port.

Commodore (Retd) Md Khurshed Alam, Chairman of MPA, presided over the meeting, held at its conference room.

The port users demanded shifting of customs house from Khulna to Mongla, introduction of one-stop service at the customs station and more dredging in the port channel.

They said they have to face a lot of problems now in getting customs clearance.

'free time' for containers from 15 days now to 30 days.

While stressing the need for proper maintenance of stacking yard and roads inside jetties, the port users also appealed for reducing freight charges and construction of bridges over rivers from Dhaka to Mongla.

MPA Chairman MK Alam assured members of the Shippers' Council more facilities at less cost and requested the president of Steamer Agents' Association to reduce freight charges.

President of Shippers' Council Farhad Ahmed Akhand and representatives of Mongla Dock Workers' Management Board were present in the meeting.

The tests for admission in first year honours courses under 2003-04 academic session in the university begin today and will continue till April 26.

The tests for admission in Electronics and Computer Science, Mathematics and Physics departments under KA unit (Science faculty) will be held today while those of Environmental Science, Geological Science, Statistics and Chemistry departments will be held tomorrow.

The schedule for tests in other departments are as follows.

GHA unit (Life-Science Faculty)-April 19 and 20, KHA unit (Social Science Faculty)-April 21, 22 and 24, GA unit (Arts faculty)-April 25 and 26.

About 42,192 admission seekers are likely to vie for 1,100 seats in 24 departments under four faculties.

The tests will be held in five shifts from 9 am to 5 pm everyday while all classes and examinations will remain closed during the period.

## ALLEGED SEXUAL ABUSE OF STUDENT JCD activist expelled from SUST

Two Awami League (AL) activists were killed in clashes with BNP rivals in Khulna and Kushtia districts on Thursday and Wednesday.

Our Khulna Correspondent reported that Akhtar Shikder, 24, a member of Terokheda upazila Awami League died at Khulna Medical College Hospital (KMCH) at 11 am on Thursday.

According to victim's father Idris Shikder, he was fatally injured at 9:30 am on the day in an armed attack by a group of BNP men at Madupur village in the aforesaid upazila.
