Cabinet okays extension of SC judges' retirement age

Plan to empower MPs to impeach judges rejected

The cabinet last night rejected a proposal for omitting the provision for the Supreme Judicial Council from the constitution and empowering parliament to impeach any judge for gross misconduct.

The cabinet approved the pro-posal for extending the retirement

age of Supreme Court judges by two years from 65 to 67. If the proposal is signed into a constitutional provision, former chief justice KM Hasan, who was ambassador to Iraq during the rule of the late president Ziaur Rahman, will be the chief of the next

caretaker government in 2006. The retirement age for the chairman and members of the Public Service Commission and the comptroller and auditor general have also been proposed for extension from 62 to 65 and from 60 to 65.

The government will now recall the 14th constitution amendment bill from the parliamentary standing committee on law, justice and parliamentary affairs ministry and incorporate the new provision for

age extension of the judges into it.

The law ministry proposed revival of the constitutional provision of 1972 after the Supreme Judicial Council opened a probe into the misconduct of High Court Additional Judge Syed Shahidur

Leader of the Opposition Sheikh Hasina yesterday led a procession of thousands of her supporters through streets in Dhaka, repeating the call for immediate resignation of the government to clear way for

Frontline leaders of the Awami League (AL) and its front organisations, joining the procession, protested what they said was BNP-Jamaat alliance's total failure to run the country.

The demonstrators shouted antigovernment slogans amid loud drumbeats and carried banners reading 'No More with this Government, 'Step Down Immediately' and 'Alliance Failed to

"Armed men rule the country. Armed cadres of the Jamaat-e-Islami are controlling everything," Hasina told a rally in the build-up to the procession that ended close to the Suhrawardi Udyan after two
