Study to evolve efficient transport system for city

Dhaka Transport Coordination Board (DTCB) has launched a study titled Strategic Transport Plan' to evolve an efficient transport system for the

city and its surrounding areas. Funded by the World Bank, the eight-month-long study involving about Tk 10 crore began last month and it will be completed by this year, said Quamrul Islam Siddique, execu-tive director of the DTCB, at the study launching ceremony yesterday. DTCB Chairman and Mayor

Sadeque Hossain Khoka attended

the ceremony as chief guest. The Strategic Transport Plan will outline the next 20 years of development of transport system for the city and its surrounding areas such as Narayanganj, Tongi, Savar, Munshiganj, Narsingdi, Gazipur and Manikganj, said Quamrul Islam.

He hoped that the major foreign investment for implementation of the plan will come from Asian Development Bank (ADB), Department for International Development (DFID) and Japan.

David H Jarrett, team leader of the study, spoke of the study area, prime objectives and formulation of a multimodal land transport policy comprising water, land and railways.

The study will examine all the previous priority projects to develop the transport system, he said. Dr Rahamatullah, head of trans-

port division, Center for Policy Dialogue (CPD), stressed the need to

focus on the water transport. Referring to the planned circular waterway around the city, he suggested making a link between the
