Flash floods inundated more areas in Sylhet, Sumanganj, Moulvibazar districts as the Surma and the Kushiyara rivers continued to rise yesterday

Floods triggered by rain also damaged vast IRRI-Boro lands in Brahmanbaria, Netrakona and Habigan Our Staff Correspondent in

Sylhet reported that at least 60 per cent IRRI-Boro croplands have reeled under water in Sylhet, Sumanganj Moulvibazar as waters were gushing out through several breaches in embankments of the Surma and the Kushivara. The two rivers rose further yesterday at all points amid scattered intermittent rains

More areas have gone under water in Jakiganj, Kanaighat, Gowainghat, Beanibazar, Jaintapur Companiganj and Golapganj upazilas. In Gowainghat upazila, at least 80 per cent paddy has been damaged Educational institutions have

> Criminals threw acid on a threevear-old child at Krisnawpur village n Bargaon union of Sonaimuri thana on Saturday.

The ill-fated child is Riad Mahmud, son of Abul Basar who was admitted to the district general hospital in a critical condition.

Two criminals named Abdul Hye 25, and Abul Kashem, 45, abducted him from his mother's lap in the morning on the fateful day and left the child at midnight with severe acid injuries on the courtvard of their house, police and relatives told this correspondent.

His mother Fatema Siddiqa disclosed that the incident occurred as a sequel to enmity. The child's uncle, Morshed Alam filed a case with Sonaimuri thana accusing eight persons including the two abductors on charge of demanding extortion from them. The alleged extortionists were threatening them for a long time to withdraw the case. As they did not withdraw the case the culprits took revenge in such an inhuman manner, she said

Highway robbery at Dumuria

Highwavmen looted belongings of passengers of transport vehicles at arms point for three and a half hours at Dumuria on Saturday night.

According to victims, the highwaymen looted money and gold ornaments from passengers of buses, auto-rickshaws and rickshaw-vans by erecting barricade on Gutudia bridge.

The highwaymen were led by Mahabbat Sarder, Mohsin and Zaman who were arrested by joint forces during the Operation Spider Web in November last year. At that time arms were also recovered from them. But mysteriously they were released on bail.


