Zimbabwe's decision to drop 13 rebel white players gives cricket authorities the upper hand in a racially-charged row but the sport is the real loser.

As legal writs flew from both sides alleging breach of contract, on the pitch the scene looks set for a record-breaking drubbing for Zimbabwe at the hands of Sri Lanka in Tuesday's opening one-day

Dropping the rebels brought to a head a fortnight of wrangling between the board and the players that began when Heath Streak's tenure as captain ended after he questioned the composition of the selection panel.

The Zimbabwe Cricket Union (ZCU) said Streak had resigned from all cricket -- only for the former captain's father to deny the report.

Twelve other players refused to play in the home series against Sri Lanka unless he was reinstated. They also demanded the removal of Max Ebrahim from the selection panel and that the ZCU acknowledged "transgressions" by its board

The board claimed the players were in breach of contract, and fired all 13, who represent the bulk of Zimbabwe's international experience. Now there is talk of up to three leading black players joining the

"Obviously it has set us back," ZCU chief executive officer Vince Hogg said, quoted in the Sunday Times in neighbouring South Africa. "We've now named a second side and have to go forward. Cricket in Zimbabwe doesn't stop because of

The ZCU was forced to pick an inexperienced squad, led by 20year-old Tatenda Taibu. He is set to become the youngest captain in Test history if there is no deal by the first Test in Harare on May 6.

With the rookie side picked for the first two one-day matches, the Sri Lanka tour is set to break more records, with Muttiah Muralitharan on the verge of a Test wicket bowling

The timing is terrible, with Australia due to tour straight after Sri Lanka and England expected in October, despite agonising over whether to go to the former colony or face ICC sanctions.

The row stems from the ZCU's decision two years ago to implement development plans more aggressively -- including aiming to field five black players in every match. Instead of yielding greater inte-

It is no accident that all 13 rebels are white. Cricket remains a sport traditionally played and followed by a greater proportion of Zimbabwe's white minority than the black major-

But the squad of 14 that the ZCU named to play in Tuesday's onedayer in Bulawayo includes only one white player.

Even before the latest flare-up Zimbabwe had been struggling since Andy Flower and Henry Olonga famously wore black armbands during the 2003 World Cup to "mourn the death of democracy in our beloved Zimbabwe"

Both men moved abroad shortly afterwards and neither has played for Zimbabwe since.

Venus back to winning

Venus Williams captured her first WTA title in 14 months, rallying to defeat Spain's Conchita Martinez 2-6, 6-2, 6-1 in the final of the Family Circle Cup.

Williams won the 189,000dollar top prize at the 1.3 milliondollar event and took her 30th career crown, the first since February of last year at Antwerp. "I'm really so excited," Williams

"I want to start this year from here.

It was the first title for the fourth-seeded American since a six-month injury layoff for an abdominal strain following her loss to younger sister Serena Williams in last year's Wimbledon

The victory gave Williams a much-needed confidence boost heading into the European claycourt season on the road to next month's start of the French Open.

Despite falling behind, Williams stuck with her match attacking short balls and playing her best match of the final US clay court event of the season.

'That was important for me to do," Williams said.

"I'm really just trying to stay positive during my matches.

don't always do that. I need to stay positive and keep rolling." Williams fired 37 winners past Martinez despite struggling in the first set. She netted a forehand on her first match point but won when the Spaniard sent a backhand

Martinez broke Williams to open the match and dominated the first set, but Williams shut her down from there.

"The first set was a little bit shaky for me," Williams said.

"I had to adjust to her game. I had to slow it down and get really aggressive.

Williams won seven games in a row, breaking to claim the second set and racing to a 5-0 lead in the third before Martinez held, setting the stage for Williams to hold in the final game.

Lara mark may remain untouchable: Ponting

Australia's desire to win Test matches in quick time makes surpassing Brian Lara's world record score virtually unattainable, skipper Ricky Ponting said here on Monday.

Ponting doubts whether Lara's magnificent unbeaten 400, made for the West Indies against England at Antigua last week, will ever be surpassed because few skippers in world cricket would be willing to jeopardise a winning position by allowing one batsman to spend so long at the crease.

Lara's quadruple century -- the first in Test history, eclipsing Matthew Hayden's former world mark of 380 -- was almost 13 hours in the making.

Lara has been criticised for being selfish in chasing the world record until after lunch on the third day of the fourth Test and not leaving enough time for his team to win the match. "It's hard to imagine an

Australian player doing it, just because of the way we play our cricket. It's generally not the way we play," Ponting said

"I've read some of the reports in the paper over the last couple of days about Lara's innings.

"Their whole first innings might have been geared around one individual performance and they could have let a Test match slip because of it.

"They ran out of time in the

game -- that's not the way the Australian team plays." Matthew Hayden's previous

world record 380 against Zimbabwe in Perth last October took just over ten hours in a match Australia won by an innings and 175 runs early on the fifth day.

Ponting said then captain Steve Waugh's decision to let Hayden keep batting, in an effort to break Lara's previous world record of 375, was the exception to the team rule.

"It was a very rare thing what we did with that Zimbabwean Test match, for Matty to be able to bat for as long as he did and go on and make that big score," Ponting

"He was given the opportunity to go on and break Brian's record and he did that. He was going to be given another half an hour, or 20 minutes, to try to get to 400 but unfortunately he got out. Ponting, Hayden, Lara and

India's Sachin Tendulkar are regarded as world cricket's preeminent batsmen, but the Australian skipper said he was only vaguely interested in individual records.

"It would be nice if you could be the world record holder but at the end of the day, as we've seen, it doesn't necessarily win you a Test match, which is what we're all about." he said.

"Everyone will be chasing it. there's a record there now I'm sure a lot of batsmen around the world would like to have their name next to. But we'll have to wait and see how things pan out

over the next few years.' Australia play two Tests in Zimbabwe next month.
