Internet fair a crowd-puller

THE internet service providers got an opportunity to give their extensive services exposure through the 'Internet fair 2004'.

Organised by the Internet Service Providers Association of Bangladesh (Ispab), over 65 stalls including three of foreign companies and 44 ISPs showcased their services and products.

Solution providers, publication houses and official sponsors filled the other stalls. The four-day internet fair that drew a huge crowd generated great enthusiasm came to an end on April 18.

Almost all the ISPs at the fair offered 10-20 percent discount on prepaid connections along with attractive gifts such as mugs, key rings, T-shirts and free internet cards. The broadband service providers tried to explain their services such as bandwidth shares, distance coverage, line of sight and non-line of sight wireless internet, ethernet and radio link. A free browsing section organised by Bdcam was crammed full of crowd during the fair hours.

SpeedCast, one of the leaders in internet broadcast based in Hong Kong, participated at the fair along with Eyeball of USA and Globetek Infosys of India.

SpeedCast Ltd. is a joint venture company established by TechSystem Limited and Asia Satellite Telecommunications Co. Ltd. (AsiaSat). It is currently serving a number of ISPs in Bangladesh.

Eyeball is a voice-over internet protocol (VoIP) billing system and Globetek Infosys is a solution provider with Linux-based software that has set up over 50 organisations in Bangladesh including Bangladesh

Alcatel, a leading solution provider, held a seminar on their local projects and DSL technology on

On the same day, two VoIP billing software were also presented. Rezaul Hassan, CEO,

Post and Telecommunications Minister Aminul Haque chaired the closing ceremony, while Abdul Awal Minto, president of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industries (FBCCI) and Enayetullah Khan, editor, Holiday and New Age, were present as special guests.

Akhtaruzzaman Monju, president, Ispab, Ershad Shafi Chowdhury, secretary general, Ispab, Azhar H Chowdhury, systems and software director, Grameen Cybernet, Mustafa Jabbar, CEO, Ananda Computers, and Sarwar Alam, chairman, Basis were among the guests present.

"Our ministry is committed to providing every support to the ICT sector. We have broken all kinds of telecommunications barriers and now it is up to you to make use of this opportunity," the minister said.

"The four-day fair drew over 30,000 people to the stalls," said the Ispab president. The fair was co-sponsored by GrameenPhone, Samsung's local distributor Electra Telecom, REACH, RC Cola and SpeedCast.

Reve systems, a local company, introduced their VOIP software 'itelbilling', a real time, accurate billing and monitoring software. The software is compatible with Cisco products.

The other VoIP software was presented by Eyeball. The product

HP to supply 4,600 PCs

HEWLETT Packard (HP) organised a press conference to explain their markets and strategies in locally and internationally on April 19 at Hotel Sheraton. TTV Chari, vice president, Personal Systems Group (PSG), South East Asia/Taiwan headed the press conference along with Yeo Chee Yong, country sales manager, PSG, Bangladesh, Brunei, Cambodia, Nepal, Bhutan, East Timor.

It was announced that HP had won a deal to supply more than 4,600 units of HP Compaq business desktop d220 PCs to the ministry of education. These PCs will be distributed to secondary and higher secondary schools, colleges and madrasahs to facilitate the education sector and improve the knowledge base of students across the country. The PCs will be shipped and installed by the end of May this year. HP's premier business partner Flora limited played a pivotal role to win this contract.

This is the second time HP has won a deal with the Ministry of Education. Last year, HP sold 2,200 units of HP Compaq business desktop d220 PCs to the ministry.

"This is indeed a significant win for HP in Bangladesh and we are proud to be part of the government's project and to contribute to the success of information technology in the education sector. We are

pleased that the ministry of education has continued to partner with HP and Flora and chosen to equip the education sector with the HP Compaq d220 performance based PC," said Chari.

HP has diversified their product segments in Enterprise Systems Group (ESG) 21 per cent Personal Systems Group (PSG) 29 per cent, Imaging and Printing Group (IPG) 30 per cent, HP Services (HPS) 17 per cent and HP Financial Services (HPFS) three per cent.

At the meeting, Chari said, they have introduced over 665 new products in financial year 2003. "Not a single technology merger has been successful except HP and Compaq because we are profitable and we have the market share" said, Chari.

Its revenue for this quarter has been 42 per cent in Europe, Middle East and Africa (EMEA), 36 per cent in the United States, 11 per cent in Asia Pacific, seven per cent in Canada and Latin America and four per cent in Japan.

HP products are compatible with all operating systems including, Microsoft Windows, Linux and UNIX. In competition with Dell and IBM, HP is still on top.

"More than 100 stock exchanges and large companies like Shell, MSNBC, Nestle, Dreamworks, NYSE, Amazon, Alcatel, Disney are all powered by HP" said Chari also mentioning that HP follows the strategy to provide high technology at low cost with best customer experience.

Stone Age Jewelry

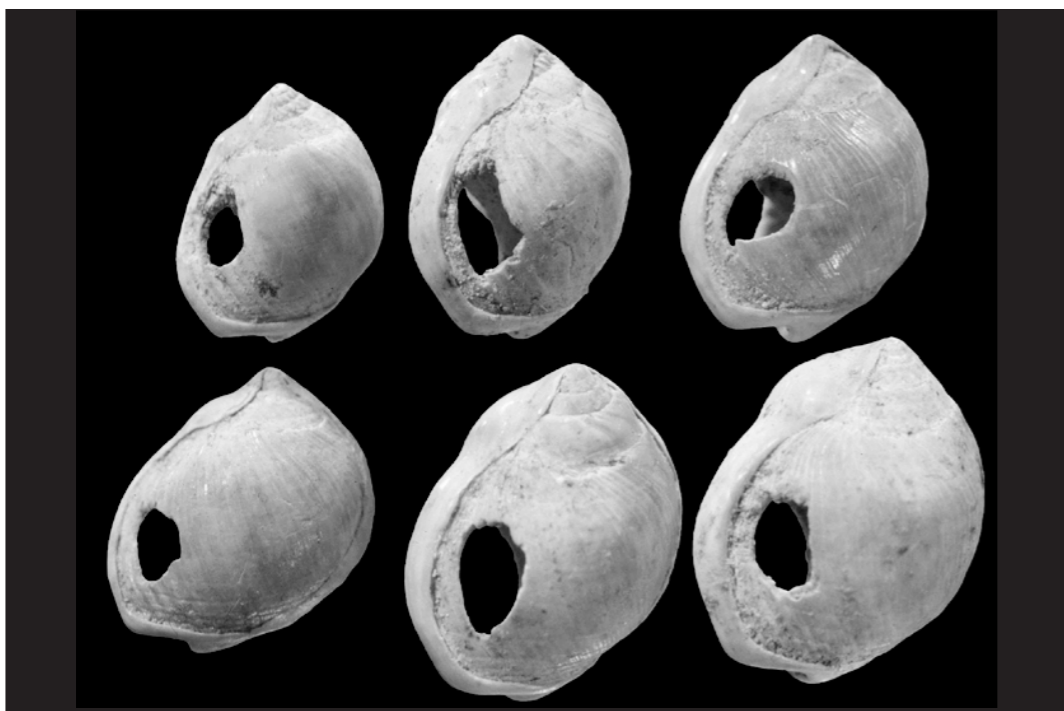

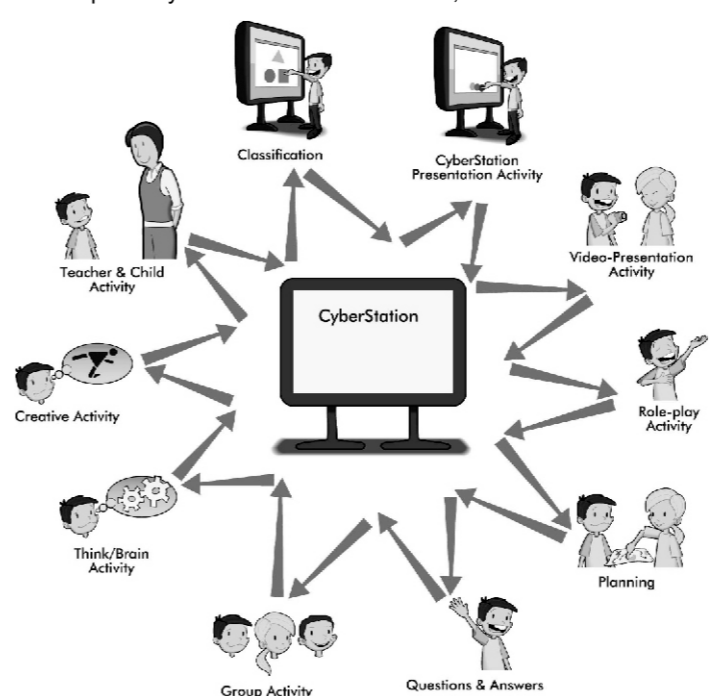
The KEY2Learning concept is built on an advanced interactive system of education, which assists teachers in engaging students from ages three to 15 with exciting and interactive programs.

"The problem with the current education system is that we are still using the same tools, procedures and examples used by our ancestors in our current teaching methods," said Mamun Abdullah, managing director, KEY2Learning Bangladesh.

"Such trends bore children and it has been proved through research, that even if they try, they cannot concentrate on lessons for more than three minutes," he explained.

To make learning interesting, creative, and entertaining, the KEY2Learning concept has been extremely effective with children from the age group of 3-15 years.

The system uses Computer Instructional Learning (CIL) or Information Environment as opposed to the prevalent procedure of Computer Aided Learning (CAL).
