One gunned down in Mohammadpur

Local hoodlums gunned down an electrician at Bijli Mahalla in Mohammadpur yesterday.

The victim Abdul Quddus Molla, 25, received six bullets in the head, chest and abdomen near Darul Jannat Jame Masjid at 11:30am.

He was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where the doctors declared him dead.

Quddus was living at a mess in the area for last two years.

Victim's sister-in-law Laizu Begum claimed that he had no enmity with anyone, but Mohammadpur police said the hoodlums, who killed Quddus, were his friends.

In another incident at Gandaria in Sutrapur, a neighbour almost severed the wrist of a rickshawpuller following an altercation over a boundary wall.

The injured Julhas Mollah, 42, who lives at a slum near Gandaria Railway Station, entered into altercation with Mir Hossain at around 2:30pm when the latter attacked him with a machete.

Locals rushed Julhas to the DMCH and later shifted him to the Orthopaedic Hospital as his condition deteriorated.

Two accused flee from High Court

Two accused in a bomb explosion case yesterday surrendered to the High Court for anticipatory bail but melted into a crowd when the judges ordered that they be sent into police custody for two weeks.

Police hunted for the accused, Hafizur Rahman and Mahbub, but could not find them anywhere in the vicinity of the court.

Hafiz and Mahbub along with four other accused surrendered before the court and sought bail in an explosion case of Batiaghata of Khulna district.

The bench comprising Justice Nazrul Islam Chowdhury and Justice Farid Ahmed gave the order.

Police, however, took four others - Taqibur Rahman, Aziz Sheikh, Abdul Mannan Molla and Zahid Sheikh - to custody.
