





This is a bilingual edition of English and Bengali translations of the leading poet of Orissa, Sitakant Mahapatra. Needless to say, those who love reading poetry and eagerly await an opportunity to read quality poems, will be delighted to come across a book like this. The English translations in it will satisfy this craving in poetry lovers worldwide. Sitakant Mahapatra was a highly educated Indian poet who had won many laurels. He was also an amiable and modest human being, free of any prejudice. The themes of Sitakant Mahapatra's poems are apparently very ordinary, for example 'The Lemon Tree,' 'Grandfather,' 'Paddy Harvesting,' 'The Vulture,' 'Mother,' 'My Grand Daughter,' 'Destiny,' 'Autumn,' 'The Ruined Temple,' 'The Ballad of the Beggar Boy,' 'The Rock,' 'Grandmother' etc. But these common themes become extraordinary at the touch of the poet's talent. His experiences and his worldview have extracted from his pen many poems of quality that may appear simple but are by no means easy to write.


Explorations into Dynamics of a Hidden Nation


Memoirs of a Police Officer of the Raj

The First World War had brought a revolution in people's ideas of equality and liberty everywhere. In India, the Home Rule agitation had heightened political awareness and ambition across the length and breadth of the country under the British Raj. The Rowlett Bill (1919), based on the controversial recommendation of the Rowlatt Committee, was enacted to deal with acts of sedition on the lifting of the Defense of India Act after the war. This was the backdrop when Philip Finney joined the Bengal Police in 1924. For 23 years Philip Finney had an interesting and often exciting career in Bengal Police, particularly because it was during a period when India, and Bengal in particular, was in turmoil and in the grip of the terrorist movement.

Nevertheless, radical social transformation leading to economic advancement of the masses, liberation of the latent energies of the people and reduction in discrimination and inequality has not been on its agenda, despite public protestations to the contrary.


**Parisian Portraits**


