It was just 12:25pm.

The call for prayer wafted from the nearby mosque as Awami League leader Ahsanullah Master, MP, stood up to leave the dais set for the council of ward No. 10 unit of Shechchhasebak

A staccato burst of fires rocked the Noagaon MA Majid Mian High School field. For the next five minutes, all hell broke loose as the guns blazed away.

Nobody knew what is happening, or why. Only they knew they have ducked death anyhow. Some dived under tables, some just lay there unprotected until the guns stopped.

The nine to 10 assailants came to the council venue scaling a chest-high boundary wall in the southeastern corner of the school and planted themselves behind the dais.

"I found the gang to whip out their firearms and spray the dais with bullets from behind the decorative curtain," said a woman who witnessed the wanton killing from the rooftop of a nearby house.

The AL called a hartal for tomorrow, stick- and iron rod-wielding demonstrators uprooted railway lines in Tongi, cut the town's road links to Gazipur, torched three offices of local BNP and its front organisations and damaged at least

"After speech by local leaders, convenor of Tongi Upazila Shechchhasebak League Mojibur Rahman announced names of newly elected president and general secretary when we heard call for Juma prayers," said injured Sharifudin Akash, who was sitting near the dais.

"The leader (Master) stood up and asked the organisers to end the programme, saying he'll attend the Juma prayers. He said the names of other members of the committee will be announced later," said Akash, also member of the convening committee of Tongi Upazila Shechchhasebak League. "As he was waving hands to the

crowd in a gesture to leave, several gunshots from behind the stage rocked the area and I found him collapsing on the stage," he said. adding he himself took a bullet in his right arm.

As gunshots stopped, some of the organisers found Master lying on the dais with blood gushing out from three bullet wounds in the chest.

The main opposition Awami League (AL) has called a countrywide dawnto-dusk hartal tomorrow to protest the killing of Ahsanullah Master, a party lawmaker from Gazipur-2

constituency. An emergency meeting of the AL Central Working Committee (ALCWC) yesterday evening took the decision to enforce the shutdown, blaming the 'government high ups' for the killing. The meeting was held at AL's Dhanmondi office with acting party chief Abdus Samad

Azad in the chair. The pourashabhas where elections are scheduled for tomorrow will remain out of the purview of

Briefing newsmen, AL General Secretary Abdul Jalil said, "The killing of Ahsanullah Master is the result of a conspiracy by government high ups and they have pat-ronised the killers."

He said on February 12, police attacked Ahsanullah Mastar while he was leading a pro-hartal procession in the city and that was also a bid to kill him.



Tongi lurches into virtual battlefield

Force (BSF) on Benapole border Tongi exploded into outrage at the killing of Awami League lawmaker Sources said both Bangladesh Ahsanullah Master, with opposition Rifles (BDR) and BSF reinforced workers taking to streets, torching a their strength along the border train, uprooting rail tracks, vandalising shops and smashing cars before BDR said the BSF personnel shot setting them afire. dead two unidentified smugglers at

The hometown of Master lurched into a virtual battlefield, as armed demonstrators and police exchanged fire, leaving two youths dead and another injured at Natun Bazar, not far from Noagaon MA Aziz Mia High School where the AL leader was killed.

Witnesses said 30-year-old Afaz Uddin, a worker of a textiles factory, was killed on the rooftop of a onestorey building and a youth, Hanif,

died in crossfire in Natun Bazar at

Several hundred demonstrators from Tongi damaged the country retreat at Banashri of Giasuddin Al Mamun, a friend of Prime Minister Khaleda Zia's son Tarique Rahman, prompting police to impose Section 144 there.

They blocked Mymensingh Road and the railway through Tongi, snapping train service from Dhaka to other districts until 10:00pm. They uprooted rail tracks and burnt tree trunks and tyres on roads.

Hundreds of police and paramilitary BDR personnel made futile attempts to quell the tempers of the protestors. Section 144 was imposed in Tongi in the afternoon.

Anti-graft body to function in a month: Saifur

The Anti-Corruption Commission will start functioning within a month, said Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman yester-

While talking to the newsmen yesterday at his Gulshan residence, Saifur said Prime Minister Khaleda Zia may announce formation of the commission at the inaugural ceremony of the Bangladesh Development Forum (BDF) today.

Referring to The Anti-Corruption Commission Bill 2004, he said that a selection committee, yet to be formed, will work towards naming the chairman and members of the commission.

Development Forum (BDF) meeting opens in Dhaka today to review the pledges the government made at the past two BDF meets.

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia will inaugurate the meet at the Sonargaon Hotel in the morning to be attended by delegates from 32 countries and donor agencies.

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman, World Bank Vice-President (South Asia Region) Praful C Patel and International Monetary Fund (IMF) Representative Nissanke Weerasinghe will also speak at the inauguration. Corruption, confrontational

politics, lack of governance and law and order downslide may move front and centre in the discussion, as hinted by donor representatives. The Local Consultative Group

(LCG), a platform of local donors,

said law and order downslide coupled with recent escalation in political violence has left a negative impact on Bangladesh as a trading partner and investment location. Seven sessions to be held in the

BDF meet opens today

next two days will also discuss policy and programmes to deliver the Poverty Reduction Strategy Paper and Millennium Development Goals, good governance, government-NGO partnership, health and education, trade and investment climate, infrastructure for growth and development and aid gover-

The LCG has prepared seven discussion notes on themes of the

The donors have expressed satisfaction with economic development. They said economic growth continues to pick up, GDP growth increased from 4.4 percent in 2002 to 5.3 percent in 2003. They also anticipated that 5.5 percent growth

projected for 2004 is likely to be achieved.

The donors also expressed satisfaction over foreign reserves, exports and inward remittances -the three economic indicators that show a powerful comeback.

On the growth in the banking sector, the donors said it also progressed and was on track despite small problems.

But some commitments to governance reform the government made to the donors at the BDF meetings in 2002 and 2003 remain unfulfilled, according to the discus-

sion notes of the donors. A table prepared by the LCG shows the government fell short of delivering promises on reforming political process, the judiciary and the public administration and ensuring transparency and
