An eight-year old Indian player took the spotlight when the 7th United Insurance and United Leasing International Masters Chess Tournament began yesterday at the National Sports Council conference

Sahaj Grover, a student of standard four in Kuachi Hansaraj Model High School in New Delhi, was exuberant while playing his first game against Bangladesh FIDE Master Khondokar Aminul Islam.

The wonder kid drew his family's attention to the game after sitting ir front of the board at the age of 4.

"Nobody in our family was interested in chess but we are now very much involved because of his huge interest. Although Vishwanathan Anand is our national hero, my child is a fan of Gary Kasparov," informed Sahaj's mother Dimple Grover, who is accompanying the young prodigy along with her 13-year old elder son.

Sahai, whose rating is 1957, was declared the youngest Indian among rated players in February 2003 after clinching the Under-17 championship as well as lifting the state cham pionship title for the fourth time. "He is too young but a very tal-

Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA) secretary general Zafar Imam is expected to be the last individual to be interviewed by the probe committee investigating the national football team's 9th SAF Games debacle in Islamabad After talking with the BOA secre-

tary general today, the probe commitwill submit its findings to the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) this week.

The three-member probe committee, headed by Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) vice-president Abdur Rahim, has talked to officials, players and members of the media who covered the Games. "We will talk to Zafar Imam tomor-

row," Manzoor Hossain Malu, a member of the probe committee, told The Daily Star Sport yesterday. "We have almost completed our task and hopefully will be able to

submit our report to the BFF on May

12," added Malu, who is also BFF deputy general secretary.

Observers have termed the investigation a farce because many blame BFF for Bangladesh's failure to qualify for the semifinals.

It is believed that BFF high-ups instead of coming forward to take responsibility, are passing the buck onto coach Shahidur Rahman

If anything a faulty selection procedure could be the root problem. The BFF National Team Management Committee (NTMC), featuring former national footballers

like Kazi Salahuddin, Golam Rabbani Helal, Sayeed Hasan Kanan, is in charge of running the whole show

Coaches appointed by the BFF under guidance of the NTMC, had selected the preliminary squad ignoring key players who were still eligible for the under-23 competition.

Exclusion of experienced players like national custodian Biplab, defenders Titu, Mahmudul Hassan and striker Moni weakened the team and led to its poor showing. So, it is likely that the investigation committee will go after the NTMC.

Shantoo, appointed by BFF as the country's under-17 national coach, was reluctant to take charge at such short notice. Currently in the USA on a two-week vacation, Shantoo has already stated that he didn't have the right players at the right time while the NTMC reportedly blasted the BFF for the entire situation.

"That summed up the whole terrible tragedy for me, a mother suggesting that only in death could her son be free from his burden."

#### Olympic door open for **Pillay**

Dhanraj Pillay may still realise his dream of playing in a fourth Olympics, India's hockey chief said on Friday, lashing out at the national upheaval over the veteran playmaker's omission from the list of 30 probables.

Indian Hockey Federation (IHF) president Kunwar Gill said the 35year-old Pillay will not be out of contention when the selectors pick the squad for the Athens Games to be held in August.

"I have always maintained that a couple of players from outside the pool of 30 could be part of the Olympic team," Gill told reporters. "But I can't say if Pillay will certainly be included. That we will know only when the team is named in

July."

Gill, a renowned former police officer credited with curbing Sikh militancy in the northern state of Puniab in the 1980s', slammed the sympathy shown to Pillay in the media by former players and admin-


