Little growth in next year's ADP

At Tk 21,475cr, the ADP for FY05 will see only 5.78pc increase

STAR REPORT

The Annual Development Programme (ADP) for the next fiscal year beginning July has been proposed to be set at Tk 21,475 crore, a meagre 5.78 percent higher than this year's development outlay.

The planning ministry will table this proposal for the prime minister's approval today.

The proposed ADP contains a local currency contribution of Tk 14,325 crore and a foreign compo nent of Tk 7,150 crore.

The new ADP heavily

emphasises transport and power sectors as each got 16 percent of the total allocation. It will be followed by the education sector with a 14 per

The foreign currency component has been envisaged lower than last union leaders will be elected by workers themselves.

Proshika HQ raided again

Police arrest 12 staff

Law enforcers arrested 12 Proshika employees in a raid on the nongovernmental organisation's headquarters in Mirpur yesterday for attacking some of their disgruntled colleagues, who demonstrated allegedly under police protection.

The raid -- a second in 10 days -came after up to 25 Proshika rebel employees from its different units, led by a deputy director who was suspended from the NGO a day before, marched to the head office and came under attack with brickbats at about 11:00am.

Later in the day, police arrested a retired army man, Jahangir, believed to be the bodyguard of Proshika President Qazi Faruque Witnesses said the rebel

HSC exams start, 180 expelled

For the first time in the country, only about 180 examinees were expelled for adopting unfair means on the first day of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations under the seven education boards that began yesterday.

Over 1,000 examinees were expelled for copying on the first day of the HSC examinations last year.

About 6.29 lakh examinees including those doing Alim under Madrassah Education Board, HSC vocational and business adminis tration under Technical Education Board, are appearing at the examinations this year. The number is about 40,000 less than that of last

Killers threaten Ahsanullah's family

The assassins of Awami League (AL) lawmaker Ahsanullah Master are threatening to take away his body from the grave in an attempt to press the family into withdrawing the

"Since my father's assassination, the killers are phoning and threatening us to withdraw the case,' Ahsanullah's younger son Zabid Ahsan Sohel told The Daily Star vesterday.

"One rang up last night and said they would take away his body from his grave unless we withdraw the case," Sohel said, adding they have also received a number of death threats in the last four days.

"And so, our relatives are not letting my brother or sister or me to answer phone calls.'

The Criminal Investigation Department (CID) yesterday, meanwhile, formally launched a probe into the high-profile assassination of the main opposition's frontline lawmaker. Its detectives visited the place of occurrence and spoke to complainant of the case and Ahsanullah's relatives.

Police have failed to arrest any of the killers who, Sohel said, have told the family that they have the backing of the administration and are immune to arrest or trial.




