## **Ton eludes Ponting**

#### AFP, Harare

Captain Ricky Ponting came within nine runs of his 16th one-day century at Harare Sports Club Tuesday when Australia beat Zimbabwe in the first of three internationals by seven wickets and with more than 10 overs to spare.

Named man-of-the-match afterwards, Ponting scored a flourishing 91 to at least claim a 41st halfcentury.

He needed only 93 balls, hitting three sixes and six fours. Ponting and Damien Martyn put together a 144 runs partnership for the third wicket that left Zimbabwe on the back foot to the end.

Martyn finished undefeated on 74, the 22nd time he has passed 50 in this form of the game.

The innings got off to a shock start, however, Matthew Hayden falling to the first ball bowled by Zimbabwe discovery Tinashe Panyangara.

The final scores were Zimbabwe 205-9, to which Australia responded with 207-3.

# An unlikely finale

Porto and Monaco will receive their reward for astute management and a refreshing lack of respect for the European elite when they line up in the Champions League final in Gelsenkirchen, Germany, on Wednesday

This will be only the fifth European Cup final, and the first since 1991, not to feature a club from one of the big four leagues of Spain, Italy, Germany and England.

A final meeting between two middleweights like Porto, who won the European Cup for the only time in their history in 1987, and Monaco, who will be playing in the final for the first time, would have been almost unthinkable at the start of the season.

Monaco were 80-1 at the start of the group stage, and Porto 40-1, to win the tournament.

The two sides have made it on strict merit, however, and they have the potential to serve up a far more entertaining final than last year's dour all-Italian meeting between winners AC Milan and Juventus.

Porto, led by wily coach Jose Mourinho, followed up their UEFA Cup win last season by beating

His action was under review by the International Cricket Council, after umpires David Shepherd and Srinivas Venkataraghavan reported him during the fourth Test against Australia at St John's last year.

Lawson's progress and his return were hindered by a simultaneous back injury that limited his bowling during the period that his action was under review.

Lawson has captured 29 wickets at 24.31 runs apiece in seven Tests. During the 2003 home Test series

against Australia, he distinguished himself with a hattrick in the third Test at Bridgetown and career-best figures of seven wickets for 78 runs at St John's.

Teenaged fast bowler Ravi Rampaul is the only uncapped Test player in the squad. He has played 14 one-day interna-

tionals over the last 14 months however.

All the fast bowlers, except leftarm medium-fast bowler Pedro Collins, are under the age of 23 with Tino Best and Fidel Edwards completing the pace attack.

Unorthodox left-arm spin bowler Dave Mohammed has also earned a recall after an unimpressive Test debut against South Africa at Cape DASW DM HZS Town in January.

West Indies captain Brian Lara. who reclaimed the individual world batting record with an unbeaten 400 against England last month, returns to captain the side after missing the preceding ODI series that West Indies swept 3-0.



Most of the 30 female footballers who are part of the second batch in a camp organised by Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF), are looking forward to switching their careers

Under the directive of Asian Football Confederation, the BFF has launched its women's training programme and the second camp was inaugurated at the Dhanmondi Women's Sports Complex yesterday.

It was the first step by the BFF in almost three decades to introduce women's football in the country.
