Car lifters kill driver in Keraniganj: 4 held

The murder of a rent-a-car driver came to light yesterday three days ofter the grupsome act.

A gang of car lifters yesterday admitted that they had murdered Mohammad Jasim, 23, in Keraniganj and dumped his body in a river at Sirajdikhan in Munshiganj and stole his car on May 23.

However, police could not retrieve the body from the river till filing of this report at 8:00pm yester-

day.

After the murder, the gang drove to Chittagong and sold the car to

another gang.

Double Mooring police recovered the Toyota car (Dhaka Metro-Ga-15-5536) left abandoned on a road in Chittagong yesterday after

Kotwali police of Dhaka informed

them about the incident.
On Tuesday night, Kotwali police arrested Shah Newaj Kabir Taj, a member of the gang, who confessed to the murder during an

interrogation.
On the basis of his statement, police also arrested Khorshed Ali Banti, Ashraful Hasan Rosy and Abdul Latif, father of a member of the killing squad, in a pre-dawn raid.

Police said the gang hired the car from the City Rent-a-car Service at Muktangan at about 2:00pm on the day and took the driver inside an abandoned house at East Subaddah in Keraniganj.

Six gang members waiting at the house strangled the driver after serving him a glass of soft drink mixed with some drugs. They also cut open the midriff of the body.

Dhaka reaffirms one China policy

Khaleda, Wen Jiabao hold meeting

Bangladesh and China yesterday reiterated their resolve to strengthen ties between the two countries.

This was stated at a meeting between Bangladesh Prime Minister Khaleda zia and Chinese Prime Minister Wen Jiabao at the Hong Qiao State Guesthouse here in the afternoon.

Khaleda, now here to attend the conference on Scaling up Poverty Reduction, reaffirmed Bangladesh's commitment to one China Policy in the years to come.

The Chinese premier described Bangladesh as a trusted and tested friend of China and said his country would celebrate this year the 30 years of Bangladesh China friendship. He invited Khaleda to attend the celebration.

The meeting took place in a cordial and warm atmosphere and continued for over one hour.

Khaleda referred to the proposal for an agreement between the two countries on bio-technology in the field of agriculture and called for concluding the agreement as soon as possible. She also made plea to transform the loan for Pagla Water Treatment Plant, Karnaphuli Paper Mills and Di-ammonia Phosphate

Plant into concessional credit.

She also sought concessional credit for 500 MW power plant at Bheramara and setting up of a methanol plant with equity participation of China.

TheBangladesh prime minister also sought concessional Chinese credit and grants for the development of energy, power, railway and other sectors. She made plea for Chinese assistance for North Dhaka Sewerage System. reduction of distance between Laksham and Dhaka railway stations, 5,00,000 line digital telephone project and Rangpur-Khalashipur coal mining feasibility study.

Referring to the possibility of huge investment in Bangladesh in textiles sector by Chinese investors, Khaleda said by setting up textile industries under joint venture, they can reap the benefits of GSP facilities being provided to Bangladesh by the EU.

She urged China for taking measures to reduce trade gap between the two countries. In this context, she pleaded for allowing zero tariff on 83 more items besides existing zero tariff facilities on 34 items Bangladesh now enjoying under Bangkok Agreement.

The prime minister sought Chinese assistance for modernisa-

tion of BDR, Police, Ansar and VDP.
She also sought cooperation in the field of defenCe. She wished success of the Olympic Games-2008 and World Trade fair-2010 China is going to host.

The Chinese Premier assured all possible cooperation for industrialiSation of Bangladesh and said Dhaka should send feasibility reports on possible industrial units which may be set up with Chinese assistance.

One arrested in Rajshahi for demanding toll from Indian diplomat

Police yesterday filed a case against a person who demanded Tk 50 lakh in toll from the assistant Indian high commissioner in Rajshahi and threatened him with death if he does not pay the money.

Posing as an al-Qaeda operative, Rabiul Islam, 45, sent five letters to the Indian diplomat demanding various amounts of up to Tk five crore in toll.

Police said they arrested Rabiul,

a quack of Naodapara in Shah Makhdum thana, on Monday after an investigation into the letters and filed the case accusing him of extortion.

He was placed before a magistrate's court and police sought ten days' remand for him.

Rabiul told the magistrate that he wrote the letters and sent those to the Indian High Commission office at Upashahar at different times until May 16, police said.
