"I'm totally in control," he said at the England training camp ahead of the Euro 2004 championships which gets underway in Portugal on June 12.

A turbulent few weeks for the England captain in which he has seen Real fail to win a single trophy and his marriage scrutinised following accusations of infidelity culminated with his sending off in the penultimate game of the Spanish season for abusing a linesman.

His fury as he screamed at the official evoked memories of the petulant Beckham who was sent off against Argentina in the 1998 World Cup for flicking out a heel at Diego Simeone, but the 29-year-old insists

those days are long behind him. "People have said that the red mist is back and I'm back to the days of that game against Argentina.

"Sometimes you're so frustrated and tense that those things happen and that's been the case because we really haven't played our best football in the late stage of the season

"I'd heard players saying the offending phrase to the linesman before looking ahead to England's opening game of the tournament and the referee just before, but against reigning champions France. maybe it sounded more aggressive coming from me."



Ruud van Nistelrooy wants to end his playing days at English Premiership giants Manchester United -- and then get out of football altogether.

The Netherlands hitman, under contract at Old Trafford until 2008, had previously said he wanted to see out his career at PSV Eindhoven, where he made his name before moving to Manchester. But following discussions with United boss Alex Ferguson, the 27-year-old only has ambitions at Old

, Trafford "When I signed my new contract recently, I didnt only sign for the money," van Nistelrooy told British daily The Sun.

"I had a long talk with Alex Ferguson where he explained his future plans. His ambition is to win the Champions League again and I'm very proud that I can work on that with him. I agreed with his vision," he said.

"It was very simple then to sign my new contract the next day."

ntimated a return to the Netherlands and PSV, where he struck 57 goals in 67 league

But less than three weeks ahead of representing his country at Euro 2004, the forward revealed the attitude of Dutch supporters made him change his mind.

Les Blues keen to avoid WC debacle

France will be looking to put up a far more resolute defence of their crown in Euro 2004 than the fiasco that surrounded their meek surrender of the World Cup two years ago when they crashed out in the first round

Under Jacques Santini, who replaced the hapless Roger Lemerre, the French cruised through their qualifiers.

However while most pundits would see them and England progressing smoothly from a group that includes Switzerland and Croatia, France's experience of the 2002 World Cup when they lost to Senegal in the opening match should serve as a warning to the players

France open their campaign with the potential tabletopper decider

with England and a draw would probably suit both of them as defeat would leave the nerves tingling as they approach the next two matches.

Santini, though, is refusing to look that far ahead and has told his players not to be obsessed by the England clash where they will come face to face with a lot of the players they face each week in the Premiership.

"This will be a very special match with many players from the same club, so it will be strange for some of them," said the former French international, who cut his managerial teeth with Lyon.

"But we must not get fixated on this match and it would be a mistake to read too much into it."

However in a fallback to the 2002 debacle. Santini will have been concerned to hear that his star player Zinedine Zidane is like the rest of his Real Madrid teammates complaining of fatigue which was a common complaint among the French side in the World Cup.

France are not the only team with something to prove. England as ever go in with huge

expectations on them and with all the speculation over Sven-Goran Eriksson's future seemingly over, the Swede believes that his side can go on and win their first tournament since the 1966 World Cup.

"If they (the players) are fit I think so, yes, they can win.

"You need a bit of luck to win a big tournament and I hope we have that

Eriksson based his confidence on the fact that a large part of the squad had been with him at the 2002 World Cup where they went out in the quarter-finals to Brazil, whose coach Luis Felipe Scolari is now in charge of hosts Portugal.

"A lot of them are the same (as in the World Cup squad) with two more years' experience which is important and those who were in Japan and still in the squad should be

"I am happy with the balance. Hopefully, they will stay fit and if they

stay fit I think we will have a very, very good team."

Of prime concern to England fans will be the fitness, mental and physical, of captain David Beckham, another to suffer the Real Madrid malaise towards the end of the season culminating in his being sent-off in the penultimate league match.

> However the unflappable Swede said he wasn't worried in the slightest about his playmaker in chief.

"He (Beckham) had some difficult times that's for sure and I saw the game when he was sent off but I have always said that when he puts on the England shirt he will do an excellent job as he always does and will put away what has happened lately."

While France and England can at least approach the finals in a fairly optimistic frame of mind the same cannot be said of Germany, though the manner in which they stumbled through to the 2002 World Cup final may encourage them to think they can repeat that feat.

However in a group consisting of

old rivals Holland and dark horses the Czech Republic, Rudi Voller's men can think of having a longer summer holiday than the other two sides.

Voller said it was the hardest group and that was before his side were at the wrong end of a 5-1 thrashing by a mostly inexperienced Romanian side.

However Voller has kept faith with the majority of the players that lost to Brazil in the World Cup final, despite an alarming slide in form from goalkeeper Oliver Kahn and playmaker Michael Ballack.

"Ballack has not had his best season but he is hungry to give his all," explained the 1990 World Cup winning striker.

"I hope he will be the same player he was at the 2002 World Cup."

Italy coach Giovanni Trapattoni who has warned of not taking Germany lightly - will also be hoping to bow out with his team going one better than last time round when they lost to France with a golden goal in extra-time
