# **Roddick leaves US empty**

## French Open

AFP, Paris

Defending women's champion and top seed Justine Henin-Hardenne, and men's second seed Andv Roddick went crashing out of the French Open on Wednesday on a day when home players left a stunning impression on the season's second Grand Slam.

Belgian Henin-Hardenne still struggling with the after effects of a virus which had sidelined her for six weeks, lost 7-5, 6-4 to Italy's Tathiana Garbin.

Roddick, the US Open champion. lost to French world number 125 Olivier Mutis who clinched a famous 3-6, 6-3, 6-7, 6-3, 6-2 second round win

The defeat means that for the first time in the history of the tournament, there will not be an American man in the third round.

"I started well but I let him back in and once that happened, he was a different player," said Roddick of a man who had won just one match on tour all year.

The American, whose big service game needs a quick court, had to play under heavy skies and with the Suzanne Lenglen Court soaked and weighed down by a late afternoon downpour.

Mutis had put out another American, Robbie Ginepri, in the first round to follow compatriot Jerome Haehnal's stunning defeat of former champion Andre Agassi. "I haven't had a great year," said


Tim Lamb is to step down as chief executive of the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) at the end of September. He has held the post since the ECB's inception in 1997.

captain of his era. Having silenced his critics with a gutsy century to guide England to nations

Zimbabwe is in danger of being suspended from Test cricket after a revolt by the country's top white players forced two Test matches against world champions Australia this month to be cancelled

Former Australian Test bowle Tim May, who is chief executive of the Federation of International Cricketers Association (FICA), said the ICC must investigate claims that Zimbabwe was ignoring cricket's equality and integrity.
