

Video game shop owner killed

An owner of a video game shop died after his friend allegedly hit him with a grinder at his home at Madhya Basabo in Sabujbagh yesterday.

Taiyabul Alam Jewel Hossain, 25, owner of Video Max Media, was sleeping when Mahbub, also his

business partner, came to his house at around 9.00am.

Mahbub entered the room where Jewel was sleeping and hit him with a grinder when other family members were busy with household chores, said Samsul Alam Suman, younger brother of Jewel.

Mahbub fled the house soon after the incident.

The family members rushed Jewel to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where he died at around 1:30pm.

Meanwhile, Sabujbagh police recovered the body of a woman aged about 20 from Shantipara Lane in South Mothertek at around 5:00am.

Results of the admission tests of Jahangirnagar University (JU) will be published today.

The viva-voce of the successful candidates will be held on June 2 and 3. The admission process will start on June 14 and continue till June 21.

The results will be posted on the university's web site -- www.juniv.edu.

Application forms for admission under different quotas such as player, freedom fighters' ward, cultural activists and tribal student, will be available at Agrani Bank, JU branch.

Meanwhile, the university goes on summer vacation today.

Classes and examinations will resume on July 1 after the 32-day vacation.

However, offices of the university will remain closed from June 5 to 13.
