Arunima: A home away from home

She exuded confidence as she spoke. "I have a combination of intelligence, education and merit. Why can't I live on my own?" asked 54-year-old Atia Begum.

A former schoolteacher, separated from her husband, Atia found a room of her own at 'Arunima', a project of a social welfare organisation Proshanti Foundation -- inaugurated on May

This is a hostel with residential facilities for unmarried, divorced or widowed women over 30. Designed to provide a safe haven, it also helps to generate employment for them.

"We do not like to call it a hostel," said Salina Akther, general secretary of Arunima. "Inmates should refer to it as their perma-

nent home," she said. Salina feels the necessity of places like Arunima became intense because of the changing social scenario. There are a number of young unmarried, divorced and widowed women who are confronted with the severe problem of a place to live.

In most cases women live with

parents or siblings despite many hardships and disadvantages. Most of the time they are unwillingly dragged into mundane

"Smooth relationship with relatives that prevail when a woman lives with her husband changes when she is separated, divorced or widowed," said Atia

"They are left with no option other than to be accommodative in such a situation," Salina said. She added that student's hostel or working women's hostel is not the right place for women who find them misfits in such surroundings.

"A divorcee or spinster in her 40s cannot cope and adjust with the young in a hostel," she explained.

"But in a place like Arunima, women with common backgrounds and can share their joys and sorrows," Salina said. She was substantiated by Atia who claimed the inmates help each other to overcome grief like she did by assisting her roommate in overcoming the pangs of agony after her husband and son died.

Apart from accommodation, the boarders enjoy food, medical facilities, group insurance, library

and TV. Internet, computer games, gardening, gymnasium and newspaper facilities. Single or shared accommodation is available at a cost of Tk 3,0007,000 a month.

"We have to charge our boarders as we do not get any financial assistance from home or abroad.' said the general secretary. She added the organisation is trying to accommodate women over 30 from the lower income group by engaging them as service providers i.e. cooks, cleaners for paying members.

"We provide free accommodation and pay wages for their services," she said.

The organisation not only provides accommodation for its paying members but also helps them to develop as small entrepreneurs. They are provided with training, raw material and knowledge in different market oriented

At present it can accommodate 25 but plans to set up a complex of 20.000 square feet for 150 women. The authorities said they also plan to put up hostels like Arunima in cities outside Dhaka.

Bangladesh Library Commission proposed

The government proposes the formation of Bangladesh Library Commission (BLC) to stretch library facilities all over the country. This commission will work for the improvisation of the existing libraries and build new

A committee formed by the government has already submitted its report to the cultural affairs ministry on the formation and substruc-

Cultural Affairs Secretary Mudabbir

Hussain Chowdhury said that the proposal is now being analysed. "We will hopefully submit the final report in the cabinet meeting for approval soon.'

Dr Wakil Ahmed, convenor of the formation committee of the library commission, hoped if help to spread knowledge at grass root levels, which is the demand of the present times. Readers all over the country could get themselves updated with current news.

"With the goal to build a knowledge-based society that would sweep away all obscurity, we have suggested the formation of an effective commission that will help reach our goals," said the convenor. According to the report, 2,962 existing

libraries all over the country will come under the commission's purview. The commission will work for the improvisation of these libraries with suggestions, financial aid and infrastructure support from the authorities.

Among the proposed libraries, there are 68 public and three national libraries. Among the rest, 2,250 are libraries for various educational institutions and 641 are private. Most libraries are in the urban areas depriv-

ing the rural society of libraries. The committee has proposed building new libraries under this commission at the necessary places. The secretary said that under this commission they have planned to stretch libraries at

upazila level. "We have planned to built up community auditorium cum libraries at every Upazila and these libraries will be under supervision of the commission." he explained. The proposed commission will consist of 18 members headed by an eminent educationist

and will work to build up professionalism developing a wage structure for this sector. The upcoming commission will also take responsibility to build up a digital network

among the libraries all over the country and will provide internet facilities as well. to the cultural affairs ministry and will get funds

No reference lab yet to monitor standard of path labs

The much-awaited reference laboratory is yet to be set up despite official instructions.

The main objective of such lab will be to conduct quality control over the country's diagnostic centres. It will also train patholo-City dwellers allege that the city's patho-

logical labs have become a threat to their health. Wrong diagnosis, variation in pathological test rates, illegal commission from path labs, lack of proper equipment and finally non-acceptance of health certificates in foreign countries are some complaints.

"A visit to seven to eight labs around Dhaka showed that fasting blood sugar test ranged from Tk 78-102 while urine culture and sensitivity test cost anything between Tk 203-317." said Kamal Ahmed, a patient referring to a diagnostic centre on Elephant

A senior doctor from the pathology department of a medical college said: "Most of

complaints are true. Some doctors insist on patients going to a specific lab for tests because it allows him to earn a monthly commission." "Even if the patient requires just one or

two tests, the doctor prescribes a range of

unnecessary tests to be done as well. This is quite a normal procedure," he added. Prof Shah Monir Hossain, a seni mittee member of the Pathological Society, explained that for the last 10 years or so they

had been demanding a reference lab. But
