'Take action against communal forces'

Bangladesh Hindu Bouddha Christian Oikya Parishad yesterday expressed deep concern at the rise of communal and fundamentalist forces in the country.

At a meeting in the city, the parishad leaders called on the government to take stern action against these elements.

They also urged all political parties, civil society leaders, and socio-cultural organisations to be united against the activities of fundamentalists.

The meeting was held in two sessions at Tejgaon Church Community Centre. Major Gen (Retd) CR Dutta presided over the first session and Advocate Siril Shikder the second session.

The meeting also expressed concern at the amendment to the Vested Property Return Act as this has deprived a minority community of its land rights.

It also condoled the deaths in building collapse at Shankhari Bazar in the city.

One shot dead, two bodies recovered

Police recovered the bodies of two unidentified men in the city yesterday while criminals gunned down a man in Dhanmondi on Thursday night.

Ramna police found the body of a victim, in green shirt and black trousers, on Kazi Nazrul Islam Avenue at around 4:00am.

Police suspected the killers had dumped the body there after killing him in another place. The body, bearing stab injuries in the head, chest, stomach and hands, was sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) for autopsy.

Uttara police recovered the body of another victim, aged about 25, at Sector 7 at about 5:30pm.

In a separate incident, Mohammad Selim Sharif, 28, was shot dead at Mitali Road in Rayer Bazar, Dhanmondi at around 8:30pm on Thursday.

His wife Minu Begum said a gang of criminals attacked Selim when he was going to his sister's house at Maneswar Road to bring her (Minu) back home as she was staying there for a couple of days.

'People's expectations not reflected in budget'

Different political parties, trade unions and student organisations yesterday criticised the proposed national budget for 2004-05 fiscal year, saying it did not reflect the expectations of the people.

Five Left Party, an alliance of left-leaning political parties, held a rally at Muktangan in the city to protest the budget.

Speakers at the rally rejected the budget terming it 'anti-people.'

They said the budget reflected the views of imperialist powers and it has been tailored to deceive the people.

Tipu Biswas, Mahbubul Haq, Sheikh Mohammad Shahidullah, Abdus Salam and Shahidul Islam Sabuj addressed the rally.

The Jatiya Party (Manju) in a statement said there is no direction in the proposed budget on how to fight against poverty, illiteracy and unemployment and to improve health services.

The budget did not touch the current national problems includ-

ing downside in law and order, widespread corruption and unnecessary expenditure, said the statement signed by party Secretary General Sheikh Shahidul Islam.

In another statement, Acting President of Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal Moinuddin Khan Badal and General Secretary Syed Zafar Sazzad said the budget would not bring any positive change to the fate of poor people.

President of Bangladesh Chhatra League Liakot Shikdar and General Secretary Nazrul Islam Babu, in a joint statement, said the highest allocation for education sector is an eyewash.

Leaders of Jatiya Gono Front, Bangladesh Samajtantrik Dal, Biplobi Oikya Front, Gonotantrik Mazdur Party, National Teachers-Employees' Front and Bangladesh Trade Union Kendra also criticised the budget.

Salesman shot dead in Ctg

Armed muggers shot dead a salesman of a bakery and looted a confectionery shop in separate incidents in the port city on Thursday night.

Bhola Mia, 40, a salesman of Gausia Bakery, was returning home in his van after collecting money from different shops when the muggers intercepted him at Kalirhat in Pahartoli at around 9:30pm and tried to snatch the money.

The gang shot him when Bhola tried to resist them, police said. He died on his way to hospital.

In another incident, about eight muggers stormed into Kohinoor Bakery at Chawk Bazar and looted Tk 40,000 at gunpoint at around 9:00pm.

Police press charges against five accused

Police have pressed charges against five accused in UP chairman Amir Azam Khan murder case.

They are Bulbul Hossain, Sumon alias Nuruzzaman, Shaikh Belal, Disco Sattar and Shawkat Hossain alias Shakha.

The prime accused in the case Abdur Rashid Shaikh alias Tapu was killed in a gunfight between police and outlaws at Fakirhat on May 21.

Investigation Officer Dewan Koushik, who is also a sub-inspector of Khulna Police Station, submitted the charge sheet to the CMM's Courton Thursday.

Former vice-president of Batighata upazilla unit of BNP and chairman of Amirpur union parishad Amir Azam Khan was gunned down in front of his residence at Sarkarpura under Khulna thana on January 29 this year.

SI Anwar Hossain lodged a FIR with Khulna Police Station as a complainant.
