AL makes JS comeback

Main opposition joins House today, sends MPs to JS bodies, accepts proportionate distribution of women's reserved seats

The Awami League (AL) joins the budget session of parliament today and moves to participate in the House activities including nomination of party deputies to parliamentary standing committees in a major shift in the main opposition party's position.

The AL at its parliamentary party meeting yesterday also agreed to accept proportionate distribution of women's reserved seats in parliament and contest the upcoming by-election to Gazipur-2 constituency that fell vacant with the killing of AL lawmaker Ahsanullah Master on Many 7.
