WOMEN'S RESERVED SEATS IN JS

HC asks govt why system not unconstitutional

The High Court yesterday in a rule on the government asked why the provision of reserved seats for women in parliament, made in the 14th amendment to the constitution, should not be declared unconstitutional

The court order followed a writ petition the women-rights groups filed on Sunday challenging the constitutional amendment introduced to pave the way for 45 reserved seats in the Jatiya Sangsad for women. Parliament passed the provision on May 16.

The High Court division bench of Justice MA Matin and Justice Tarik-Ul-Hakim issued the rule after

The petitioners cited no fewer than 14 legal and moral grounds against the incorporation of the provision for 45 seats reserved for men in parliament.

They held the provision was made in violation of the constitution and an infringement of the constitutional rights of women as it allows indirect election to the reserved

tion provides for direct election. The petitioners also said the provision barred women, who do not belong to any political party, from contesting in the elections to the reserved seats, as the seats have to

The petitioners said according to the constitution all of them are eligible to become legislator and they have long been fighting to establish women rights. But since they do not belong to any political party, they have been barred from becoming lawmaker.

The petitioners added both ruling and main opposition parties pledged in their election manifesto that they would make way for direct election of women to enhance women's representation in parliament, but they did not live up to their promise.

The counsel for the petitioners submitted that according to the constitution, parliament can make special provision in favour of women for their advancement but in this case the amendment did not

Cabinet nods to bank law changes

The cabinet yesterday approved amendments to the Bank Company Act 1991 to tighten the central bank's noose on loan defaulters, make every one from bank directors to bank union activists more accountable and check unruly

The act has been amended in nine areas, some of which are very significant and some are just revision of word arrangements.

Loan defaulters have been redefined. Previously, a borrower failing to repay loan six months into the expiry of deadline became a defaulter. Under the new definition, a borrower becomes a defaulter as soon as the loan is marked as classified under the Bangladesh Bank

The central bank marks a loan classified in case of failure to repay within three months of the deadline SEE PAGE 11 COL 7

At least one person was killed and over 56 were injured as a bomb went off at a rally of the main opposition Awami League (AL) in Derai in Sunamganj yesterday afternoon.

AL lawmaker and presidium member Suranjit Sengupta narexploded just after he left the dais delivering his speech at 4:45.

Seriously injured 26 including district AL Vice-president Nurul Islam Sarder and Derai AL President Aftabuddin were on and around the dais and rushed to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital, while about 30 were taken to Derai Upazila Health Complex. Abdul Wahid, 40, of Matargaon

village succumbed to his wounds minutes after he was brought to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital at 8:05pm. He was a driver of a motorised boat.

Several thousands of people attending the meeting ran helterskelter after the explosion. As the news spread, panicked shopkeepers closed their shutters.
