Wimbledon suffered its first all-day washout for five years and only the 31st in its 127 year history when torrential rain, gale force winds and biting cold wiped out any prospect of play.

After a frustrating and miserable day, All England Club officials finally conceded defeat at 6:45 p.m. (1745 GMT) leaving 45 first round matches in the men's and women's singles still to be completed.

Start of play on Thursday and Friday has been brought forward by an hour to compensate for the backlog while the men's doubles has been reduced to the best-ofthree sets up to the quarterfinal But with more rain forecast for


