## Find out alternatives to toxic chemicals

### Policymakers say at workshop

Scientists and academics have been asked for finding out alternatives to toxic chemicals to protect human health and environment from persistent organic pollutants (POPs)

Addressing an inception work-shop titled 'Bangladesh: Preparation of the POPs National Implementation Plan under the Stockholm Convention", the ministers and policymakers said toxic chemicals are being used in the country for decades mainly for food production.

So alternatives to harmful pesticides and chemical fertilisers are a must to discourage the stakeholders from using toxic chemicals, they added.
