Court stops move to gag media, denies stay prayer

The Appellate Division yesterday turned down a plea to ban media reports on constructions on the Sangsad Bhaban complex minutes after it also did not grant another prayer for a stay on a High Court order declaring construction of the residences of speaker and deputy speaker illegal

As soon as the bench declined to pass the order, the attorney general sought an embargo on media coverage of development work on the Sangsad Bhaban complex. The bench also declined to entertain the second prayer.

The High Court on June 21 declared the constructions illegal following a writ petition filed by Bangladesh Paribesh Andolon (Bapa) and the Institute of Architects, Bangladesh (IAB).

Bapa and the IAB in their petition said the construction of the two residential buildings on the parliament complex would greatly distort the Sangsad Bhaban's final SEE PAGE 11 COL 1

Auditor general lodges appeal with JS body for protection

Comptroller and Auditor General (Cag) Asif Ali yesterday lodged an appeal with the Public Accounts Committee (Pac) of the Jatiya Sangsad seeking its protection against violation of the constitu-tional rights of his office by the Railway Division.

The parliamentary body is now examining the rules and regulations to dispose of the appeal, the first of its kind in Bangladesh.

"I received a letter from the comptroller and auditor general on the matter. We will discuss the appeal at the next meeting," Harun Al Rashid, chairman of Pac, told The Daily Star yesterday. Earlier on July 5, the parliamentary

body decided to summon the secretary of the communications ministry director general of the Railway Division and officials concerned at its next meeting slated for July 20.

Asif in his letter said his constitutional rights were infringed on as the officials of the railway harassed his staff when they went to probe irregularities in railway's activities.

A team of Cag's office recently went to the railway division to check purchase documents, but the officials misbehaved with them and denied them access to the papers.

Record unapproved projects plague ADP

A record 38 percent of the schemes under the new Annual Development Programme (ADP) are unapproved ones, in blatant contradiction to the recommendations made by Public Expenditure Review Commission

Most of these were incorporated in the ADP not based on national priority but due to pressure from lobbyists and powerful individuals, sources say. A number of the unapproved projects are also very old, including some decade old ones

carried over for years.

Such a high ratio of unapproved projects in the ADP also indicates that the government ignored the Perc report, in which it had advised against such schemes, as they lead to wastage and lack relevance.

Like the previous years, the government this year will okay some of these unapproved projects, while a majority of them may not be considered at all by the approving authorities concerned, yet a good chunk of money will be spent against them, a Perc member appre-

At the first meeting on the new ADP, the Executive Committee on National Economic Council (Ecnec) yesterday okayed 12 unapproved projects involving Tk 1,275 crore

Khaleda doubts death threat to Hasina

Says probe reveals nothing

Expressing doubt over reported threat to the life of Leader of the Opposition Sheikh Hasina, Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday said people questioned its truthfulness as it was issued abroad when it could be given at home.

I came to know the matter from newspaper reports, but questions have arisen among all as the threat came abroad," she said, adding: 'We've launched a probe and found out nothing of its kind so far."

Khaleda said the government was trying to identify the people who made the phone calls, but nobody could be found out yet.

Replying to a question from Krishak Sramik Janata League law-maker Kader Siddiqui during the prime minister's question time, the leader of the house said adequate security measures, more than what Hasina deserves, were taken in the wake of the filing of a general diary

Bikalpa men carry 'coffin' to HC to slate rigging

The Bikalpa Dhara Bangladesh (BDB) yesterday staged a demonstration at the entrance to the High Court (HC) building carrying a coffin and a scale to protest what it said were death of democracy and massive vote robbery in the recent Dhaka-10 parliamentary by-poll.

Several hundred BDB protesters carried a big bamboo-made scale, tilted heavily to one side, symbolising 'a more weighty government comparing to the High Court'.

"These are all about Dhaka bypolls. The coffin is the symbol of the corpse of democracy and the scale shows that the government wishes weigh more than the High Court verdicts," BDB lawmaker Mahi B Chowdhury told journalists.

British oil major Cairn plans to undertake a number of programmes to bump up its gas production in Sangu offshore gas field from the present 140 million cubic feet per day (mmcfd) to 200mmcfd by the second quarter next year.

In recent times, the depleting gas field has been facing some problems, which Cairn terms as 'natural', but which now make the company unable to increase gas production as per its agreement with Petrobangla.

One of the five wells Cairn had

drilled in the offshore gas field never produced gas, while gas production from one of the remaining four wells has declined.

"We plan to re-perforate one of the four [gas producing] wells and three gas zones. Besides, we are planning to undertake three new gas well drilling and two well workovers," said Ian Halstead, country general manager of Cairn Energy Bangladesh, at a press conference yesterday to mark Cairn's reassumption of Sangu's operatorship from departing oil giant Shell Oil

*As per our prediction, Sangu is facing natural depletion. This depletion has taken place in one of the two gas reservoirs of Sangu, which is currently being used as source. We plan to tap the other reservoir. It is a healthy gas field. But, for increased production and stability, we need to work," he told the conference, where ABA Siraj Uddowlah, director, Governmental and Public Affairs of Cairn Energy Bangladesh, also
