Asked if he thought the new interim administration in Iraq is a puppet government, Fischer said, That is not the right description, it is exactly the opposite."

The second lowest bidder, Canada's Lavalin, however, objected to the manner in which the tender was being handled and said Sumitomo grossly breached the bid terms. The Canadian government officially protested against procedural violation in the bid with the Bangladesh High Commission in Canada for air' handling of the project. "We wish to ensure that our companies can compete on equal terms with those from other countries."

In the face of protest from a country like Canada, the PMO last month formed a committee with experts from Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (Buet), which found seven flaws in

Sumitomo's tender. According to rules, when the top bid is found flawed, the second lowest bidder is invited for negotiations. "But lobbyists of a certain 'bhaban' do not want the project to go to any other company," said an industry insider.
