# Bangla Kheyal

## A new dimension of classical music

TELEBRATED composer and singer Azad Rahman offered culture enthusiasts a virtual musical feast recently. In an innovative move, he translated Kheyals from Hindi to Bangla version. An enthusiastic audience listened with keen interest as Rahman, along with other musicians, presented Bangla Kheyal at the Seminar Hall of Bangla Academy on Tuesday last.

The chief guest of the programme was the Acting Secretary of Cultural Ministry, Md Abu Solaiman Chowdhury. The chairperson of the show was Wakil Ahmed of Bangla Academy.

Amir Khusro of the late 13th century was the propagator of Kheyal. This style was very popular with its regal lyrical beauty as it unfolded the various moods in different rhythms.

This sophisticated style of classical music is practiced mostly in Hindi

and partially in Urdu. So far, the venerable artistes had been practicing Kheyalin those languages.

Azad Rahman felt the incompleteness of singing the verses in Hindi rather than in Bangla, which is

widely spoken. With tremendous devotion, patience and endeavour, the noted composer and artiste gave a new life to that incompleteness by setting the words in Bangla This is a new example set by him.

By maintaining all the specialties of classical music, correctness of the ragas, the depth of music, clarity in pronouncing lyrics and the style of singing classical music, he established the originality of Bangla Kheyal. This will be a valuable addition to our culture for the promotion of classical music.

Azad Rahman is well known as a composer in the country. He is equally adept in Tappa, Kheyal, modern songs, and orchestra composition. He has made a noteworthy impact in the western world by adapting and translating the classical music of the subcontinent and composing Raga On Piano, a composition on piano.

The singers at the programme vere Dr Ashit Ray, Ustad Yasin Khan, Dr Harun ur Rashid, Karim habuddin, Shamima Parvin and others. Dinbandhu Paul and Semson Sarkar played the Pakhwaz and Tabla respectively.

### Shurjomukho

#### Set against the backdrop of the Communist revolution

he interval of the show of Shurjomukho on July 20 at the Experimental Theatre Stage, was marred by a few members of the audience giving vent to their anger. Expressing his ire, Syed Alam, a viewer, said, 'I have come to the festival several times and immensely enjoyed the shows. However, today's show has not impressed me. When we have a scant knowledge of our own culture, revolutions or even freedom fight, what will we gain by a knowledge about the revolution in Latin America? It would have been more logical if the organisers had adapted the play in a way more relevant

As part of the ongoing drama festival, Muktamancha Theatre staged M Rafiqul Islam's play Shurjomukho. The play was set against the backdrop of the Communist revolution, spearheaded by the proletariat for their rights, that took place in Latin American countries such as Bolivia, Peru and others.

Through the protagonist Arnesto's tragic death, the playwright has established the image of an ideal revolutionary who never compromises with the ruling regime. As the subplot of the play he shows the harm wrought by the collaborators in the course of a revolution. Due to the personal benefit of Parera another character in

the play, the whole movement comes to an end and the leader Arnesto dies soon after his capture by the army. M Rafiqul Islam's play is not well constructed. He has portrayed a fragmented picture of the Latin American Communist revolution. The events take place in a forest where all the characters are engaged in a battle. Through the reminiscence of some characters, he has tried to indicate--even if ineptly-- the logic behind their

As the director of the play, Shahidul Haque Khan's approach is realistic. He has followed the European Theatre trend. He basically emphasised on the dialogue

of the performers.
Shahidul Islam, as the set designer, has used some stools at several parts of the stage to create a suggestive atmosphere of the den of a revolutionary army. His light design is also very simple, but did not co-ordinate well with the acting cues.

All the artistes should give more effort to make the foreign story-based play more interesting to the audience. Moreover, they should also concentrate on the pronunciation.

#### **Azad Abul Kalam:**

### His directorial venture takes him to foreign lands

Azad Abul Kalam, the well-known director of stage plays, seeks to introduce unique ideas in Bangladeshi theatre. So far he has directed nine stage-plays. Each time he has tried to add a new element to his earlier works. He has directed Bou Basanti, a Udichi production in the Dhaka Drama Festival 2004. Azad said, 'A director has to gauge the capability of the artistes before directing a play. In addition to my own group Prachyanut, I take a lot of time to work with the other groups as a guest director.

Azad will soon be off to India with a new directorial venture. Azad said, 'I am one of the directors of



Babarnama. In the play, artistes from five countries-- Bangladesh,

India, Nepal and Sri Lanka--are taking part. The Japanese government will extend patronage to the play, which will be staged in Japan and India.'

Azad has a mixed response to the Dhaka Drama Festival 2004. As he says, 'Lately the theatre movement in Bangladesh had lost its momentum. The positive sign of the festival is the huge response of the audience. If the theatre leaders work together to promote drama it will be a step in the right direction. But if the Bangladeshi people from this medium are not up to the task, the festival will be a mere drop in the

The Sci Fi Channel confessed yesterday that The Buried Secret of M Night Shyamalan, broadcast on Sunday, was really a three-hour commercial for The Village, Shyamalan's next movie about a late 19th-century community that discovers unknown creatures living in the surrounding woods.

The show 'reveals' that Shyamalan had, like Haley Joel Osment's character in The Sixth Sense, seen dead people as a child,
