Shibir workers also prevented the procession from entering the colege premises, sources said.

Two female BCL activists were injured during the melee.

3 to die for killing woman

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced a youth along with his two accomplices to death and another to life imprisonment for the killing of his

Fifth Additional Metropolitan Sessions Judge Mohammad Rezaul Islam gave the verdict for killing of widow Guljan Bibi in Uttara on February 12, 1999.

The convicts sentenced to death are Shihabuddin Rana, Mohammad Alam and the victim's stepson Mohammad Yahia while Rafiqul Islam alias Titu was sentenced to life

According to the prosecution Yahia hired the three men for Tk 50,000 and he along with his three accomplices strangled Guljan to death with a rope at around 8:00pm. The motive was to own the victim's property.

The victim's nephew Abdul Momen on February 12 filed a

murder case with Uttara Police Station without naming any suspects. Police arrested Yahia and the convicted three and they gave confessional statements to magis-

Abdul Momen was present in the court and he expressed his satisfac-

UK aid for bridge over river Surma sought

Bangladesh has sought assistance from the British government to construct a cable bridge over the Surma river in Sylhet and implement post-flood rehabilitation programmes in the transport sec-

Communications Minister Nazmul Huda made the request when British High Commissioner to Bangladesh Anwar Choudhury met him at his office yesterday.

The minister told the British envoy that the road network is likely to be largely affected by the current flood and mentioned about the need for procuring portable steel bridges with assistance from British DFID to carry out post-flood road rehabilitation works.

Huda also informed the envoy about the steps taken by government for procurement of locomotives for the development of Bangladesh railway, formation of highway police and overall development of the transport sector, and sought British assistance in this

About the current flood, the High Commissioner said his country is ready to help Bangladesh tackle the flood and take post-flood

rehabilitation programmes The envoy also assured of continued British assistance for the development of Bangladesh's road


Communications Secretary Muhammad Shafiqul Islam was
