The most likely scenario is Klinsmann being appointed team chief, Osieck assistant coach and

Bierhoffmanager. Klinsmann, who has been involved in sports marketing since he stopped playing, has a training

licence but no coaching experience. Osieck, who not only assisted Beckenbauer but also coached Canada and worked for FIFA, could provide technical expertise while the friendly and approachable Bierhoff would be perfect for public relations.

Former Bayern Munich coach Ottmar Hitzfeld and Otto Rehhagel, who guided Greece to their Euro 2004 triumph, were offered the Germany job but both turned it down.

With a friendly against Austria next month and no time to waste before the 2006 World Cup, the DFB needs to find a solution quickly.


