government was showing no interest in executing it.

The Awami League government also took an initiative for registration of English medium schools and modernisation of Madrassa education, he added.

Reviewing the national budget for fiscal 2004-05, former finance minister Shah AMS Kibria said it would bring no good for the economy.

"Although Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman said there would be no new tax burden on people, he set a target to realise Tk 5340 crore revenue in the budget," Kibria said.

He also criticised the government for imposing income tax on poor people.

The reduction of import duty will also hinder the growth of local industry, he added.
