#### Eriksson under pressure AFP, London

Embarrassed Football Association officials have called on England coach Sven-Goran Eriksson to defend himself against mounting calls for his resignation over his affair with an FA secretary.

The FA was forced to retract a statement issued last week denying Eriksson's affair after reports in a Sunday newspaper. It has also been revealed that

chief executive Mark Palios had a fling with the same woman. Board member David Henson believes the whole affair has been an embarrassment to the FA and wants

an investigation. "It makes us look like idiots because there was a denial and then we were told that it did happen," he told The Guardian.

'We are left looking like mugs and that can't be right. We have been left high and dry. "There's so many questions to

answer and we will be expecting those to be answered this week." The FA board was not due to meet until August 26 but Henson's

comments confirm media reports an emergency meeting could be called this week. It is not the first time that Eriksson's activities have received

Two years ago he was revealed to have had an affair with TV presenter Ulrika Jonsson. He has also twice been photographed meeting with Chelsea owner and chief executive Roman Abramovich and Peter Kenyon leading to speculation he was being courted by the London

Eriksson is currently on holiday in Sweden and when he returns he will also face a critical report into his handling of England's Euro 2004 campaign by the FA Director of Football Trevor Brooking.

# Thuram says bye Football

France defender Lilian Thuram has decided to end his international career after 103 caps at the age of 32. The Juventus player, who plays

right-back for his country but often central defender at club level, won the World Cup in 1998 and European Championship in 2000.

He said the quarter-final defeat to eventual winners Greece in Euro 2004 was not the cause for his deci-

The Guadeloupe-born player said he first wanted to retire after France's disastrous World Cup in 2002 when they became the first defending champions to fail to score

But Jacques Santini, who took over as coach following that tournament, persuaded him to carry on. France have named former

Under 21 coach Raymond Domenech to coach the side to the 2006World Cup. "A newWorld Cup is looming and

new players might be more competitive than me. The Thuram cycle has come to an end," he told l'Equipe sports daily. "There's no point in playing for a

few more caps. I don't intend to try to catch up with Marcel Desailly." Desailly set a France record of 116 caps before retiring in June. Thuram scored only two goals in his international career but they

could not have been more important -- both came against Croatia in the 1998World Cup quarter-finals. He has played for Monaco, Parma and Juventus

L'Equipe said Real Madrid playmaker Zinedine Zidane (32), Marseille goalkeeper Fabien Barthez (32) and left-back Bixente Lizarazu (34) might follow Thuram into international retirement.

# Van der Lem knows it now

If in doubt, sack the boss. Asian football's impossible job -- coach of Saudi Arabia -- has claimed yet anothervictim.

Gerard Van der Lem became the 13th man to be fired by the sack-happy Saudi Arabia Football Federation since 1994 after his team's Asian Cup exit to Iraq.

A 2-1 defeat to their war-torn Gulf neighbours sent the Saudis spinning out of the competition at the group stage for the first time in their history. Within minutes of the final whistle,

SAFF vice-president Prince Nawaf Bin Faisal was announcing Van der Lem's dismissal to journalists -- even before the affable Dutchman had been notified.

As ever, the Saudis had missed the point, taking the knee-jerk decision of firing the coach when the problems affecting the side run much deeper. Van der Lem's tenure was the

longest of any Saudi coach over the past decade, his appointment follow-

ing a disastrous 2002 World Cup which included an 8-0 humiliation to Germany and a 3-0 loss to the RepublicofIreland. Yet the lesson of that calamitous World Cup campaign -- that the team desperately needed more exposure to

European opposition -- was not learned. A point-blank refusal to broaden the team's horizons beyond the Gulf

during his 28 matches at the helm. One of those matches, a friendly

against Liechtenstein, ended in defeat, while the other two matches saw a 1-1 draw with Estonia and a 1-0 victory over lowly Azerbaijan. Compare that with other Asian teams like Japan, who have eagerly

played top class friendlies against

teams such as Argentina, England and the Czech Republic, and the contrast could not be more starker. Van der Lem's dismissal also took no account of the fact that his team had been decimated by injuries to no fewer than seven first-choice players,

something attributed to the endless

grind of club football in the Gulf. But none of that mattered to Van der Lem's Saudi paymasters, who also fired Milan Macala midway through 2000 Asian Cup and dumped Brazil's Carlos Alberto Parreira two games into the 1998World Cup.

According to Frenchman Philippe Troussier, who was sacked as Oatar

coach last week after just one game of the Asian Cup, the instinct to blame coaches for poor results is typical of the problems facing Gulffootball.

Troussier believes everything from

a lack of professional administrators and proper leagues to a dearth of Gulf footballers in Europe is hindering development of the region's best sides. When we have 20 people playing in Europe you will see improvements," Troussier told AFP prior to his

'It's a problem with football in the Gulf area in general. Saudi -- no players in Europe, Emirates -- no players, Bahrain -- no players.

"The improvement of the Gulf teams is not a coaching problem. If Arsene Wenger comes to coach Qatar or UAE they will not be beating France 5-0 tomorrow. The problem is ingrained.

"The mentality of the clubs, the players, the leagues needs to change.
