

## Flood to wane next week before it rages again

Slow relief work peaks miseries; waterborne diseases spread fast

Weathermen yesterday predicted a lull in rain in the next seven days leading to an improvement in floods that blighted about 30 trillion people in Bangladesh and fuelled a rampage of waterborne diseases in the wake of floodwater recession in the north.

But the rain triggered by monsoon will pelt down on the flood-ravaged country later in the second week of August in a sign of worsening the flooding, Director of the Meteorological Department Akram Hossain told The Daily Star.

Yesterday's weathercast came as an abrupt change to earlier prediction that heavy cloudbursts and a

## Rain brings more miseries to Dhaka

Water crosses DND dam

Rain and further swelling of the rivers around worsened the deluge in the capital yesterday, compounding the miseries of around half a million people cramming flood shelters or living on house-top and lakhs more in their inundated houses.

Raging floodwater started crossing the Dhaka-Narayanganj-Demra (DND) embankment at more than 100 points. Army troops and local volunteers were stacking sandbags at the spots to block water flow.

The Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre said yesterday flood situation may deteriorate further in

Bangladesh ended their Asia Cup campaign on the losing note when they suffered a six-wicket defeat against outgoing champions Pakistan at the Premadasa Stadium yesterday.

Chasing Bangladesh's paltry 166, Inzamamul Haq's men reached the target with nine overs to spare but not before their batsmen struggled on a wearing pitch. Openers Yasir Hameed and Imran Nazir did not

look comfortable against the new-ball pair of Tapash Baisya and Tareq Aziz, who bowled a tight line and length.

Hameed, who scored a century against Bangladesh earlier in the competition, was first to go for 11 edging a Tapash delivery to Manjarul Islam at second slip.

Just after Pakistan crossed the fifty-mark, Tareq Aziz had Nazir (27) caught at square-leg.

## GAZIPUR BY-POLLS

## EC drops 14 'biased' officials, army deployed

The Election Commission yesterday decided to drop 14 polling officials with alleged bias towards a political party, relocate 22 swamped polling centres and the authorities deployed army in Gazipur-2 constituency, ending speculation of postponement of the by-polls.

The EC move came in the wake of the main opposition Awami League's (AL's) allegation that the ruling alliance was planning to rig the polls in connivance with the officials.

The AL yesterday lodged a complaint with the Election Commission (EC) accusing 34 presiding officers and assistant returning officers of working to a plan to rig the polls for the ruling alliance.

Acting Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Safiur Rahman asked the returning officer (RO) to drop the 14 presiding and polling officers and others with bias towards a political party from election duty, EC sources said.

## Loan recovery from flood-hit industries to be suspended

Knitwear sector to get Tk 150cr export subsidy Saturday

The government will suspend loan recovery from the flood-hit industrial sectors, including garments, textiles, poultry, and shrimp. These sectors will also get fresh loans for post-food rehabilitation, Finance Minister Saifur Rahman said yesterday.

Saifur also said the knitwear units will get their stuck-up Tk 150 crore in export subsidy by Saturday.

"The government will treat these industries with a caring attitude as they have been the most valuable contributors to our economy, providing employment to a large number of people," said Saifur while speaking to reporters after a meeting with the Bangladesh Knitwear Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BKMEA) at the finance ministry yesterday.

## Fewer people using sanitary latrines, coverage drops 11pc

Sanitation coverage has dropped 11 percent to 33 percent from 44 percent in recent years due to neglect of authorities and lack of sustainable technology. Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Minister Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan said yesterday.

"Every year 1,10,000 children die of a lack of proper sanitation facilities and Tk 500 crore is spent on diseases caused by the absence of sanitation facilities," Bhuiyan said at the launch of the Decentralised Total Sanitation Project.

The sanitation project, styled
