

## Help build country by using IT

Experts tell youths at seminar

Experts at a seminar have called upon the youths to come up with their full potentials to help build the country by using information technology (IT) in all spheres of national life.

The seminar on 'IT-based Higher Education in Bangladesh' was organised by the Rotary Club of Dhaka, Buriganga and Ramna in the city on Thursday.

"Still now by IT we mean only Internet, telephone, newspaper, television, but IT, in fact, is a vast area for data analysis and research," said Dr A Majeed Khan, vice-chancellor of the University of Information, Technology and Sciences (UITS).

He said IT in the developed countries is intensively used for research and development of agriculture, industry, business, management and accounting which contributed to the immense development of those countries.

After the emergence of high-tech information technology, Bangladesh has been trying to develop the sector in various ways, but due to lack of quality IT education, the standard is still below the optimal level, Dr Majeed pointed out.

"We have a lot of human and natural resources, but we could not use them in proper manner,"

said Prof Mizanur Rahman of UITS.

"Our talents are going abroad and investing themselves in the development of those countries," he added.

Rotaractor M Mosharrif Hossain urged the youths to overcome all social and economic hurdles and prepare themselves as qualified professionals for the development of the nation.

Manpower agent flees country with Tk 50 lakh

A manpower agent has fled the country allegedly with Tk 50 lakh.

Police said, manpower agent SK Zaman Khoka, owner of 'Pan Pacific Consultants' at Jali Tower, received over Tk 50 Lakh as security money from 30 people giving them false hope that they would be provided with lucrative jobs abroad. But Khoka fled the country on July 16, police said.

Other employees of the manpower agency are also absconding.

Meanwhile, one of the victim's Ujjal Debnath filed a case with Khulna thana on July 27 accusing 11 people of misappropriating Tk 50 lakh through forgery.

## Cancel Madhupur Eco-Park Project, withdraw false cases

Indigenous People Forum urges govt

Bangladesh Forum for Indigenous People (BFIP) yesterday reiterated its call for cancellation of Madhupur Eco-Park Project in Tangail and withdrawal of 'false cases' against the indigenous people.

Eco-Park will destroy the ecological balance of Madhupur Forest area and force the indigenous people to leave their own land," said Sanjib Droni, secretary general of the forum while addressing a rally at the Central Shaheed Minar in the city.

"Madhupur Eco-Park is not a project for forest conservation, rather it is a project of massive corruption," he added.

Sanjib said the indigenous people are frequently accused of being involved in anti-state activities, although they are fighting only for establishing their rights on their own land.

"Listed criminals are easily released on bail but the 'innocent' indigenous people are never granted bail," he regretted.

Sanjib alleged that the indigenous people in other parts of the country are also subjected to harassment due to encroachment

to their lands by vested quarters.

He also demanded the establishment of the constitutional rights of the indigenous people.

Prof Mejbah Kamal of Dhaka University (DU) said the government is creating a situation that has forced the indigenous people to leave the country.

"We have failed to establish the country as a non-communal state even after three decades of independence," he added.

DU Professor H K Arefin con-

demned the government's 'inhuman' attitude to country's indigenous people.

Nirmal Chatterji, general secretary of Bangladesh Chhatra Jubo Olkya Parishad, said there is hardly any representation of minority communities in any state affairs although the government always termed the country a non-communal state.

The forum leaders said they will announce their next course of action from a grand rally at

Madhupur on August 2 if the government does not meet their demands.

Earlier, they paid tribute to Pinen Snal who was killed in police firing on January 3 while protesting the construction of a boundary wall for the proposed Madhupur Eco-Park Project.

Garo leaders Albert Mankin and Rajesh Rema and Gono Forum President Member Pankaj Bhattacharya also addressed the rally.

Trial of the case is likely to begin in the first week of next month. Mosharaf said Manik Saha, Khulna correspondent of the New Age, was killed in a bomb attack on January 15 this year near Khulna Pressclub.

'Interventional Neurology a ray of hope for stroke patients'

The 'interventional neurology' ushered in a ray of hope for the patients vulnerable to stroke, the third leading cause of death after heart disease and cancer every year.

Nearly five lakh people of Bangladesh suffer from stroke, 85 percent of them sustain blockage of the artery called 'infarction' while 15 percent become victims of rupture of the artery leading to 'brain haemorrhage'.

Of them, 35 percent die after 'infarction stroke' within a month while 55 percent die after brain haemorrhage, Dr Mohammad Abdul Hayee, a fellow of the New Delhi based Sir Ganga Ram Institute, the lone organisation of its kind in South Asia, said here yesterday.

"People suffer from stroke for at least six reasons including old age, hypertension, diabetes, paralysis, smoking and hyperlipidemia," Dr Hayee said. People aged 45 years and above are generally vulnerable to stroke in Bangladesh, he added.

He said 'stenosis' is the disease of artery into the brain where the lumen is reduced by these six reasons, slowing the flow of blood. Ultimately the stenosed area becomes blocked by the blood clots over the stenosis area leading to stroke, he said.
