## Big hauls of spurious medicines, fertiliser in Rangpur

Adulterated medicine supplied to RMCH, Rangpur Jail, police suspect

Detective Branch of Rangpur Kotwali police in two drives in last three days detected two illegal factories in the town and seized huge quantities of adulterated fertiliser, cement, life saving medicines and cosmetics along with machinery and equipment used in their production.

Police arrested two persons.

Acting on a tip-off on Sunday night, a DB team led by Sub Inspector Ashok Shingra raided Moulna Boshir Uddin Cold Storage at Hazir Hat and recovered 285 bags of adulterated cement of different local brands, 572 bags of powder and 435 bags of lime stone used for producing spurious fertiliser, 350 bags of chemicals, 5600 empty cement bags, and one mixer machine.

Police arrested Zahirul Islam and Masud Alam and recorded a case against 13 people.

Police said they had been marketing adulterated fertilisers and cement in northern districts for long.

Tipped-off on Tuesday, Asok Shingra and his team raided Ruma cinema hall at about 3:00 pm and recovered huge quantities of different kinds of tablets, syrup and cosmetics.

The medicines were supplied to Rangpur Jail and Rangpur Medical

College Hospital, police suspects.

Police also arrested Mahfuz Amin, a fake chemist from the cinema hall.

Owner of the cinema Joynal

Abedin could not be arrested till writhing of this report.

It was alleged by local people that Hurmuz Ali Sarder, a former CBA

leader of Rangpur Medical College Hospital employees, was at the cinema hall during the raid but he was not arrested.

## Army pulled out of two vital Rangamati points

A sudden withdrawal of army from two strategic checkpoints at Manikchhari and Rabup Bagan at the entrance of Rangamati hill district has created concern among people about deterioration in law and order.

Army was withdrawn from there about two weeks ago without prior consultation with the district administration, official said.

Police nowman the checkpoints.

Many people this correspondent talked to said they are concerned about security because subversive elements may sneak into the district.

Many residents in Manikchhari and Betbunia have appealed to the adminis-

tration to reinstate army at the two points, Deputy Commissioner Dr Jafar Ahmed Khan said while talking to this correspondent on Tuesday.

"I talked to higher authorities but there was no response till yesterday (Monday)", he said.

"They should have consulted the district administration and political leaders before the move", he said.

When contacted, army sources termed the troops withdrawal as "adjustment due to shortage of forces".

"There is no threat to security", an army officer in Rangamati said seeking anonymity.

He did not say anything when asked whether it was done on orders from higher authorities.

## 50 hurt in Patuakhali road accidents

At least 50 persons were injured in two separate road accidents here in two days.

In an accident, 20 persons including three women were injured, 16 of them seriously, in a road accident on the Patuakhali-Galachipa Road on Tuesday.

Injured passengers told this correspondent, the accident occurred when an overloaded Patuakhali-bound bus plying with 52 passengers turned turtle and fell into a roadside ditch.

Injured passengers are Jalil, Abdul Barez, 40, Yunus Ali, 55, Suvash Chandra, 30, and Dulal, 35, of Rangabali village, Babul, 32, Nandi, 25, and Fakiruddin of Galachipa town and Jahangir of Amkhola village. They were admitted to Patuakhali General Hospital. Most of them sustained head injuries, according to physicians of the hospital.

However, the driver and helpers of the bus fled away.

In another accident, at least 30 passengers were injured, 10 of them seriously, in a road accident on the Patuakhali-Galachipa Road on Tuesday.

## GENEVA UN WORKING GROUP MEET

## Govt urged to protect rights of indigenous people

The 22nd session of UN Working Group on Indigenous Populations held in Geneva has urged Bangladesh government to take steps to protect rights of indigenous people in the country.

Violation of rights of indigenous people in the country was the main topic of discussion on the second day of the five-day session held on July 19-23, said a press release issued by the three-member Bangladesh delegation that attended the conference.

The delegation comprised PCJS (Parbatty Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samiti) leader Mongola Kumar Chakma, Chakma Circle chief King Devashish Roy and a leader of PCJS student wing Pahari Chatra Parishad. They returned home recently, the press release said here yesterday.

The Working Group sent a letter to

Prime Minister Khalida Zia expressing concern at "violation" of indigenous people's rights in different areas of the country and urged her to take steps to stop those, the press release said.

They also appealed to the Prime Minister to take prompt steps to resolve the remaining unresolved issues related to indigenous people.

The conference also discussed the CHT Peace Agreement signed between Bangladesh government and the PCJS in 1997 and expressed the opinion that said its full implementation was the only way to ensure rights of tribesmen there and establish peace in the region, the press release said.

The letter sent to the Prime Minister said the CHT accord provides a sound basis to ensure peace and justice in the long-neglected region (CHT)", Mongol told this correspondent.

The CHT Peace Accord was discussed after we put it up at the confer-

ence.

"We also raised the Mohalchhari (in CHT) incident on August 26 last year and sought an independent and impartial probe".

Delegates at the conference appealed to the Prime Minister to conduct an impartial inquiry into the (Mohalchhari) incident that left one person killed, nine women raped, 25 injured and 400 houses torched in 12 indigenous villages."

They urged the government to fully implement the CHT agreement and withdraw army from the area, Mongol Kumar said.

Delegates from the USA, France, Japan, Netherlands, Germany, Canada, Switzerland, Sweden, Peru, Philippines, Malaysia, Nepal, Holland, Australia and Greenland attended the conference, the press release said.

## Half day hartal observed for UNO's removal

A half-day hartal was observed at Sadullapur upazila yesterday at the call of an all party committee for removal of the Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO).

Police said no untoward incident took place during the period and A procession was brought out in the upazila headquarters during the hartal period but no untoward incident was reported, police said.

The hartal call was given against the backdrop of a feud between the UNO and Bongram Union Parishad chairman, who are blaming each other for corruption.

Earlier, the UP chairman, Fazlul Kaiyim Huda, alleged that the UNO did not give a correct picture of the flood situation in the area, resulting in poor supplies from government.

He had demanded immediate removal of the UNO.

Later, an all party committee was formed with Fazlul Kaiyim Huda as its convenor to launch agitation against the UNO.

The UNO refuted the allegation and said the UP chairman, facing a charge for misappropriating UP funds, is instigating people against him.

On Tuesday, all government officials and employees at the upazila headquarters held a protest meeting and demanded arrest of Fazlul Kaiyim Huda for manhandling a fourth class employee, Mohammed Ali.

Speakers at the meeting blamed Huda for "creating anarchy" and making false allegations against the UNO.

Police records  
case 11 days  
after suicide

Following an order by the Police Superintendent, Sathkira thana on Monday recorded a case against four persons in connection with alleged suicide of a girl on July 22.

The accused are Arshad Ali, Habibur Rahman and Shafiqul Islam of Chowbaria village and Romjan Ali of Bulchana village in the Sadar upazila.

Tanzila Khatun, 24, daughter of late Kuddus Gazi of Komorpur village, and her mother had been living at her maternal grandfather's house at Chowbaria village in Sadar upazila since she lost his father at the age of two.

Arshad Ali of the village developed an illicit relation with her, promising marriage. As she became pregnant, he forced her for abortion. As the matter became known, she committed suicide. Habibur Rahman and Shafiqul Islam were involved in the matter.

Arbul Hossain submitted an ejah with Sathkira thana on July 23 accusing the four for "instigating" his niece to commit suicide. But police declined to record the case. He then appealed to the Police Superintendent.

When contacted, the Sadar thana OC said, "We are trying to nab the four absconding persons accused in the case".

Procession for 'death'  
to Netrakona UNO

Night guard murder alleged

A procession was brought out in Netrakona town Tuesday evening demanding capital punishment to Netrakona Sadar Upazila Nirbahi Officer Proshanta Kumar Das for allegedly torturing an office night guard to death.

UNO office night guard Giasuddin died at Mymensingh Medical College Hospital on July 6 following alleged torture by the UNO on the night of March 30. The body was buried without autopsy.

The body was exhumed on Monday in presence of Magistrate Nitai Kumar Saha and Netrakona thana Officer-in-Charge Aktharuzzaman on a court order following filing of a case by the victim's wife with a magistrate court.

Autopsy of the body was done yesterday by a three-member team headed by Netrakona Sadar Hospital RMO Rafique Islam. The autopsy report was yet to be submitted to police and court yesterday.

The victim's wife in her case alleged that her husband died due to torture by the UNO.
