## BANGABANDHU MURDER Execution of verdict demanded

Speakers at a discussion yesterday called for immediate execution of the verdict in Bangabandhu Murder Case.

They said the execution of the verdict is being delayed intentionally.

The discussion was organised by Jatiya Oikyamancho marking the 29th death anniversary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman at a city hotel.

The speakers said Bangabandhu was an undisputed leader who always wanted to see a happy and prosperous Bangladesh.

They said the conspirators killed him to stop the progress of the country, said a press release.

Presided over by Advocate Zahirul Islam, member of the steering committee of Jatiya Oikyamancho, the meeting was addressed by Saifuddin Ahmed Manik, Abdur Rauf and Shamsuddoha.

## JCD men assault schoolteacher

Four activists of the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) on Wednesday allegedly assaulted a schoolteacher for his refusal to pay them toll in Nalcity upazila.

Police quoting the teacher said JCD activists Lavlu, Sabuj, Babu and Zafar stormed into a classroom of Merchant Secondary Girls High School at 2:30pm and beat up senior teacher Abul Kalam Azad in front of his students.

The managing committee of the school in an emergency meeting the same day condemned the incident and demanded immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of the attackers. Police, however, failed to arrest any.

## Garment worker killed in road accident

Denmark will provide Tk 4.5 crore as a grant for training and technical assistance and a loan for equipment to support establishment of multidisciplinary pain-management clinics of international standard in Bangladesh.

Tom B. Hansen, Danish Chargé d'Affaires in Dhaka, approved the assistance as part of the Danida Private Sector Development (PSD) Programme.

It said the Multidisciplinary Pain Management Clinics would be established as a technical collaboration between Bio-Consult ApS, Denmark, and Unihealth Limited, Bangladesh.

The Danish support includes training of Bangladeshi doctors in Denmark with Prof. Dr. Lars Arendt-Nielsen, who is operating one of the leading R&D resource bases in the world in the area of Pain Management, which is a growing discipline in the western world.

The Pain Management Clinics will not only diagnose the cause of pain but also treat the pain itself. Some of the common pain problems the clinics will manage include arthritis, back and neck pain, cancer pain, nerve pain, migraine headaches, shingles etc.

The clinics will also manage acute pain caused by surgery, a debilitating illness or a serious injury such as pain after joint replacements, pain during recovery from accidents, and pain following stomach or chest surgery.
