PM for Bangladesh-Indonesia joint chamber to expand trade

Outgoing envoy meets Khaleda

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday emphasised expansion of trade and other bilateral relations with Indonesia and suggested establishment of Bangladesh-Indonesia joint chamber of commerce to that end.

Her suggestions came when the outgoing Indonesian Ambassador Mansjur Maddolengeng made a farewell call on her at the Prime Minister's Office.

The Indonesian envoy, who goes on retirement after completing his last assignment of three years in Bangladesh, expressed his confidence that political, cultural and trade relations between the two friendly countries would further improve through the first meeting of Bangladesh-Indonesia Joint Commission to be held in Dhaka soon.

Maddolengeng appreciated the existing investment-friendly atmo-

sphere in Bangladesh, a country with "huge potential". He particularly lauded the quality of some Bangladeshi products, including ceramics, medicine, melamine, jute goods, and readymade garments.

The prime minister and the envoy both observed that the recent exchange of visits between Bangladesh and Indonesia at the highest level further strengthened ties between the two nations.

They referred to the commonalities in history, heritage and culture of the two countries and hoped that the existing bilateral cooperation would expand further.

The outgoing ambassador said he would try personally in his retired life to improve trade, commerce and other bilateral cooperation between Bangladesh and Indonesia.
