There were no foreigners on board the planes, which both took off from Moscow's Domodedovo airport.

### Biometric checks on visitors to US from Jan 1

**AP,** Buffalo, New York

Foreigners entering the United States across the busiest borders will be photographed and electronically fingerprinted beginning January 1 with the goal of flushing out potential terrorists.

The 'biometric checks' will be used on travellers with visas and those under the visa-waiver programme, which lets citizens from 27 nations that are US allies enter the country without a visa, said James Williams, the programme's director on Tuesday

'We want people to come to this country, to our house. But we want to know why they're coming, and we want to know did they leave on time, 'he said


