

Shop employee shot dead, body of baby recovered

Unknown assailants shot dead an employee of a shop and the body of a baby was recovered in the city yesterday.

He was identified as Mohammad Masum, 25, of Step Shoe at Elephant Road.

A sub-inspector of Dhanmondi Police Station recovered the bullet-ridden body of Masum from Road No 12/A of Dhanmondi at about 4:45pm.

He was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where the doctors declared him dead.

Masum received bullets in the head,

stomach and both hands.

Sanjida Begum, wife of the deceased, said Masum came out of his Lalbagh residence at about 3:00pm for his workplace, but he did not go there.

The family members said Masum had no feud with anybody.

In another incident, Motijheel police recovered the body of a baby from Gulbagh area on Thursday night.

Police said the body was wrapped in a cloth.

The autopsy report of the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) revealed that the baby was killed.
