"We will continue to support the government's efforts to bring an end to the August 21 issue and we are confident that the government will find the perpetrators," US Ambassador to Bangladesh, Harry K Thomas told reporters at his office yesterday afternoon following an hour-long meeting with Foreign Minister M Morshed Khan.

Asked if he was pushing the two

 $retorted, "What I\,think\,does\,not\,matter."$ Morshed said "The US wants to see democracy prosper and political stability continue in Bangladesh as it hopes to see them happen in the rest of the

He said the ambassador stressed the investigation into the grenade attacks should be carried out keeping it as the main agenda and not to be diverted by political motives.

Morshed also referred to the Ambassador's concern over jumping to conclusions on the incident.
