Shipping Minister Akbar Hossain yesterday directed the officials concerned for taking immediate measures to dredge the river routes affected by floods and repair all ferry ghats and adjacent roads from the maintenance

He also asked them to conduct a survey to see whether the navigability of the major river routes was narrowed by deposition of silt and submit report to the ministry.

The minister underlined the importance of retrieving the riverswallowed lands at Basila and other areas on the Buriganga by earth filling during the dredging of the river. He also advised them to reach a permanent solution through coordination with the Water Development Board.
