Eight years without payment for power!

26 Barisal ice factories 'defy' HC order: Over Tk 2 cr bills unpaid

Taking the advantage of a High Court stay order, 26 ice factories in Barisal city are not paying electricity bills for eight years, depriving the Power Development Board (PDB) of over Tk two core in arrears.

Besides the arrears, around Tk six lakh monthly power bills remain

Owners of the ice factories had filed a case with the High Court in November 1996, alleging 'ghost billing' by the PDB. Twenty-six cases were filed on a day. The arrears power bills till November 1996 was around Tk 1.77 crore.

The High Court in an order stayed realisation of arrears bills and asked the ice factory owners to pay monthly current bills.

But no one of them paid any monthly bill since then, according to sources in West Zone Power

Advocate Abdul Mannan Talukder, an attorney of WZPDC, said the factory owners are defying the HC order. "We will move court soon in this regard".

Some sources claimed that the stalemate in the legal process is continuing because of an alleged nexus between the factory owners and a section of WZPDC officials and employees. Sources in the WZPDC said

All the factories were then brought under one electric supply feeder by the PDB in 1996.

Sources in the Ice Factory Owner's Association denied any wrongdoing or violation of the High Court order. They claimed that power supply through a single feeder created difficulties in load sharing and that bills thus prepared are "not correct" as per

"They (WZPDC) are still giving ghost bills and we have given legal notice against this", said factory owner Hafizur Rahman. "We are ready to pay bills if prepared correctly", he added.

The government was requested to allocate Tk 20 lakh taka for flood victims in seven upazilas in the

The recent floods destroyed at least 60,000 houses completely and another one lakh 46 thousand partially, they said. Most of the flood affected fami-

lies are rebuilding their houses on their own as the government help is meager compared to the need.

In Sirajganj, the worst affected district, many flood-displaced families are still living on embankments and dykes in Kazipur, Shahzadpur and Belkuchi as their houses have been washed away.

GRENADE ATTACK

AL obstructing neutral probe, Nasir tells Ctg rally

The government is determined to track down the culprits involved in the August 21 grenade attack in Dhaka through independent probe but the opposition Awami League (AL) is not cooperating in it, speakers at a BNP rally in the port city said on Monday

The AL has formed a probe committee with "partisan lawyers", which will create confusion among people and ultimately help the perpetrators to escape, they

Chittagong City unit of BNP and its front organisations organised the rally at Laldighi Maidan as a part of its countrywide protest against the grenade attack on Awami League

State Minister for Civil Aviation and Tourism Mir Md Nasir Uddin, who is also president of the city BNP, told the rally that the attackers are enemies of the country and democracy. They must be brought to book as they want to destabilise the democratic government, obstruct flow of foreign investment thwart the country's progress.

The government has taken all possible steps for an independent probe by engaging all agencies and

Mir Nasir said the investigation commission formed in the name of Supreme Court Bar Council comprised partisan lawvers. It has no legal or constitutional base. It will rather hinder the judicial probe and create confusion among people, he

As many as 15 incidents of bomb explosion took place in the country between 1999 and 2001 when Awami League was in power but the Bar Council had kept mum then, the minister said.

"People of the country ponder whether the grenade attack was a trump card after the deadline announced by Awami League General Secretary expired on April 30", one of the speakers

One killed, 45 hurt in Kushtia clashes

Drug peddler slaughtered

One person was killed and at least 45 people were injured in separate clashes in Kushtia and Chuadanga on Monday

An alleged phelsidyl trader was slaughtered in another incident in Chuadanga

one Anwar Hossain was killed on the spot and at least 30 people were injured in a clash between supporters of Sromojibi Mukti Andolon leader Abdul Latif Lattu and former chairman of Ujangram Union Parishad Badsha Hossain Sabu at Doperpara village in Kumarkhali upazila in Kushtia. Lattu and Sabu are rivals for long over supremacy in

Police and local people said the clash erupted when men of Sabu attacked one Shamim, supporter of Lattu, when he was returning home from Durbachara bazaar.

When the news spread, Lattu's supporters rushed to the spot with lethal weapons and firearms and clashed for about an hour.

On information, police rushed to the spot, recovered the body and sent it to Kushtia General Hospital for autopsy.

Supporters of Lattu ransacked several houses and shops at Durbachara bazaar and in the villages, belonging to Sabu's supporters, sources said.

Of the injured, Montu 25, Sanwar Hosain 30, Monser Ali 35, Abdul Aziz 45, Mohammad Mallik 40, Kabil Uddin, Sashi, 20, Ratan Uddin 23, Saro, 22 and Basir Mollah, 36 were admitted to Kushtia General Hospital and other hospitals.
