He said Myanmar government is interested in taking lack their citi-

The food and disaster management minister requested the UNHCR to take effective steps for quick repatriation of the Myanmar refugees as per rule.

Both sides expressed their determination to repatriate the remaining Myanmar refugees.

call for proposals.

About 30 local and international NGOs participated in the session. The call will remain open till October 28, according to a press release.

\$100 SEVIS fee for US visa

Applicants for student (F and M) and exchange programme (J) visas for the United States will have to pay a new \$100 processing fee each to its Department of Homeland Security.

Applicants for these visas will be

required to provide proof that the new processing fee has been paid.

"No visa can be issued without proof of fee payment," says a Special Bulletin of the US Embassy.

This fee, the Student and Exchange Visitor (SEVIS) fee, will apply to students and exchange visitors who hold 1-20s or DS-2019s issued after September 1, 2004.

The fees will apply only to primary applicants and not to their spouses or children.

The fee will not affect applicants who are planning to arrive in the US this fall nor will it affect any students renewing their F1 status after a short vacation.

The fee will be charged only once per student per year of applications, regardless of how many schools to which the student applies or is accepted or how many times the student applies for a visa.

For exchange visitor applicants, the fee must be paid for each programme in which the applicant participates. The sponsors of exchange visitor programmes will have the option of paying the fee directly rather than having the participant pay.

Additionally, individuals travelling on certain US government-sponsored programmes will not have to pay the fee.

Fake Insecticide factory unearthed in Faridpur

A clandestine insecticide factory with a huge quantity of spurious insecticides was unearthed by Kotwali police at Kamdia village under Saltha thana of the district on Wednesday night.

Acting on tip off, police raided the house of ex-union parishad member Abdul Halim and found 28 varieties of spurious insecticides of huge quantity. The insecticides included both liquid and dust in packets, cartoons and bottles. Police also recovered huge quantity of dust of stones and bricks-ingredients for manufacturing the insecticides.

Police Super of Faridpur, MA Jalil said that these spurious insecticide were being sold in different rural markets in view of the increasing demand of the farmers for planting T-Aman paddy.

Police also recovered some equipments for manufacturing the insecticides. Police arrested house owner Abdul Halim, Bachchu Molla and Afzal in this connection.

The recovered insecticides included Furadan, Bayodin, Zina Fosphate, and Sunforan.

Call for united movement to oust govt

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), student wing of the opposition Awami League, yesterday urged the progressive student organisations to forge a united movement to oust the BNP-led coalition government.

At a press briefing at the Dhaka University Central Students' Union (DUCSU) building, BCL President Liaqat Sikder said they are going to form an all-party students' unity soon to launch the anti-government movement.

"We have already discussed with the Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD)backed BCL and Bangladesh Chhatra Moitree, and are communicating with all other like-minded student organisations in this connection," he added.

The BCL president said the coalition government has not only failed to arrest the culprits responsi-

ble for the grenade attack on AL rally, but also failed to detect any clue.

"Moreover, the government arrested and tortured those who protested the attack. Over 1,000 activists of Chhatra League were arrested in last 11 days," he said, adding that their leaders and activists were tortured in police custody.

Liaqat demanded immediate release of all leaders and activists including central office secretary Qamrul Hasan Khokon, Ranjit Kumar and Bidhan Kumar Saha.

"The government has been trying to hide the culprits responsible for the attack and trying to divert the incident by arresting and torturing our leaders and activists," he added.

Liaqat said the BCL will stage demonstration at district and upazila headquarters today, at educational institutions across the country tomorrow and a united demonstration on the DU campus on September 6.
