a 3-0 clean sweep at Lord's on Sunday in the final match of their NatWest Challenge one-day series against India.

But while Vaughan has overseen crushing wins by seven wickets at Trent Bridge on Wednesday and 70 runs at The Oval on Friday, his personal contributions with the bat have been nought and four.

That means he has scored a meagre 51 runs in his last seven one-dav internationals.

"I feel good and I'm driving for that score," Vaughan said after the Oval victory.

"I just try to keep doing what I have been doing and not change my game from Test match cricket to one-day cricket," added Vaughan, who has led England to a run of seven straight Test wins -- their best sequence in 75 years.

"Hopefully, sooner rather than later it will happen. I've not got enough runs yet to find my form.

"All I can do is keep going. I got a good ball on Wednesday and strangled down the legside today (Friday).
