Highway blocked for 12 hours over JU student's death

A female student of Jahangirnagar University (JU) was killed in an accident on Dhaka-Aricha highway in front of the university main gate yesterday morning, sparking massive protest by the grief-stricken fellowstudents.

Jakia Sultana Sumi, first year student of philosophy department and resident of Pritilata Hall, perished on the spot under an exportprocessing zone (EPZ) bound staff bus. The vehicle coming from wrong side ran over her at around 8:30am, witnesses said.

The incident cast a pall of gloom on the campus. Students barricaded the highway and vandalised a num-ber of vehicles and roadside shops, halting traffic movement for about 12 hours from 9:00am to 8:30pm. Thousands of passengers including

women and children in buses bound for or leaving the capital remained stranded on both sides of the block-

Sumi was waiting for a bus near the Dairy Farm Gate opposite the campus to go to her uncle's house at Taltola of Khilgaon in the capital as the university was closed on the occasion of Janmastami yesterday. She hailed from Sadar Ponkobila in

The demonstrators demanded construction of speed breakers at important points on the road and setting up of traffic police boxes where required.

The university authorities held an emergency syndicate meeting to take decisions on the students' demands.

Vice-chancellor Khandaker Mustahidur Rahman assured the students of fulfilling their demands

and they lifted the barricade at 8:30

The protesters warned that if the demands are not met by September 13, they will go for agitation from the

As tension and grief runs high on the campus, a large number of riot police have been deployed at nearby C&B and Bishmile points to avert any untoward incidents.

Earlier on Sunday night, two sugar-laden trucks went out of order on the road near the spot where the accident took place yesterday, affecting normal traffic movement. Sumi died 10 minutes after she

was run over but no-one came forward to take her to hospital. This saddened the students so much that they vandalised about 10 roadside shops and set fire to three. They set three buses, four trucks, three SEE PAGE 11 COL 2



A Dhaka court hands down its verdict on the historic Jail Killing Case today, 29 years into the brutal assassination of four national leaders, in a high-profile delay blamed on repeated interventions by different governments and judicial tangles.

Syed Nazrul Islam, acting president of Bangladesh government in exile, Tajuddin Ahmed, prime minister, M Mansur Ali, finance minister, and AHM Qamaruzzaman, minister of home affairs, relief and rehabilitation, during the Liberation War were killed inside Dhaka Central Jail on November 3, 1975.

The killing seen as a desperate bid of power usurpers came 79 days after the assassination of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and most of his family on August 15, 1975 that

Security hiked around court

Law-enforcers have tightened security in Dhaka, especially in and around the court set up close to Dhaka Central Jail for today's verdict on the Jail Killing Case

Judge Mohammad Motiur Rahman hands down the verdict on the 1975 killing of four national leaders inside jail in one of the hidcous massacres in Bangladesh's

history that numbed the nation. About 400 undercover and uniformed policemen will remain on

high alert guarding the court building, high-rises in the area and roads in and out of Dhaka Central Jail.

We will sweep the court building and its environs by metal detector and use the dog squad as part of beefed-up security measures," Deputy Commissioner (South) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police Khan Sayeed Hasan told The Daily Star.

Families of nat'l leaders see justice as distant dream

No move taken to bring back accused

Bangladesh, sources said The self-confessed killers, on the run abroad, have been keeping close



Iraqi car bomb blast, attack kill 9 GIs

Captured man is not Izzat Ibrahim, he is still on the run

A suspected car bomb blast near the rebel-held Iraqi city of Falluja yesterday killed seven American marines while two other US soldiers were killed in Baghdad Sunday, witnesses and US military sources said.

Three Iraqi national guards were also killed when they were passing near the rebel enclave, a military statement said.

"The vehicle-borne improvised explosive device which killed both Iraqi National Guard personnel and Marines was detonated late this morning near Fallujah," the state-

Poorest ADP show in 11 years

Implementation hit a new low last fiscal year even after revision of programme

Only 86 percent of the revised Annual Development Programme (ADP) could be implemented last year, the lowest performance the government made in the last 11

Locally-funded projects per-formed better with 94 percent of the programmes implemented. But oreign aid utilisation suffered badly with only 72.2 percent of the programme implemented, planning ministry sources said. In 2002-03, 95.5 percent of

locally-funded projects and 80.5 percent of aided ones was implemented. In the last 18 years, project aid utilisation rate was between 78 percent and 100 percent. Last fiscal year, the Tk 20,300

crore original ADP was scaled down to Tk 19,000 crore with Tk 12,000 crore in local component and Tk 7,000 crore in project aid. But projects worth Tk 16,345 crore including Tk 11,292 crore of

Clinton's heart bypass surgery underway

Doctors at a New York hospital yester-day began a heart bypass operation on former US president Bill Clinton that was expected to take several hours, CNN television reported.

The network announced around 1145 GMT that it had got confirmation of the start of the operation on the 58-year-old Clinton, who was hospitalised on Friday after suffering

"The operation is under way," the network said, citing sources at New York's Presbyterian Hospital. Despite his condition, the relent-

less politician spent 90 minutes over the weekend advising Democratic presidential challenger John Kerry fromhis hospital bed, it said. Clinton had been scheduled to

devote a significant part of September to helping John Kerry in his battle against President George W. Bush ahead of the November 2 W. Bush allection.

Another criminal dies in 'shootout' with Rab

Internal wrangling led to the arrest of notorious gang leader Mollah Shamim killed in an alleged shootout with Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) at Mohakhali in the early hours yesterday.

With the death of Mollah Shamim, 11 persons so far died in crossfire after Rab had taken criminals into custody.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of Rab Battalion-1 raided the Sattala slum at Mohakhali on Sunday evening and nabbed Jewel, Palash, Azad and Shafiqul, Rab sources said. Rab also recovered pistol, revolver, 16 bullets and 11 sacks of phensidyl from the operatives of Mollah Shamim.

Following their statements, Rab arrested Molla Shamim at around 8:00pm in the night.
